#### Alive!

"No one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit." John 3:5

The room was dimly lit. A machine was blinking every so often over in the corner of the room. She was in bed. He was standing next to her, holding her hand. They were alone...for now. As the hours passed, her pain grew more and more intense—and so did their anticipation. Finally, the words they had been waiting to hear: "It's a boy!" Finally, the sound they couldn't wait to hear: Baby's first cry!

The nurse eventually placed the squirming newborn in his mother's lap. He stretched out his arms and kicked up his legs, but then he quickly curled them back up into a ball. Ten fingers, ten toes, a heart that was pumping, lungs that were breathing—a healthy baby boy. He was very much alive. And yet, as healthy as he was, this child was dead, spiritually dead. No monitor indicated that. No machine would ever detect that. Only the Word of God reveals that we, like King David, have been sinful from birth; sinful from the time our mothers conceived us (Psalm 51:5). More than that, only the Word of God reveals that all of us were born dead in our transgressions and sins (Ephesians 2).

Dead. Spiritually dead. When it came to God or to faith or to obedience, we were more helpless than a newborn baby. We could do nothing. We didn't love God. We didn't want to love God. We couldn't believe in God. We didn't want to believe in God. We couldn't obey his

commands. We didn't want to obey his commands. We weren't able to make any kind of decision for Christ, accept anyone as Lord, open our hearts up to Jesus, or invite the Spirit in. We were dead, spiritually dead. We were unable to do a thing. We were unable to save ourselves.

So God, in love, stepped in to do something for us, to do something to us, to do something in us. He did it with a splash of water and the proclamation of his Word: a second birth, born now of water and the Spirit—you and I at the font in the waters of Holy Baptism. Alive. Spiritually alive. We are able to love, able to believe, able to obey. We are alive—"born again, not of perishable seed, but of imperishable, through the living and enduring word of God" (1 Peter 1:23). Alive in Christ. And God did it all—he did it all by grace and by grace alone.

#### Elders Board by Jeff Krakow

World peace is often asked for by many and we hear about it more and more at this time of year. What does God say about world peace? There will be wars and rumors of wars. There will be earthquakes and pestilence. When you hear of wars and uprisings, do not be frightened. These things must happen first, but the end will not come right away." Then he said to them: "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes, famines and pestilences in various places, and fearful events and great signs from heaven. (Luke 21:9-11 see also Matthew 24 & Mark 13)

He also tells us that we will have family conflict. They will be divided, father against son and son against father, mother against daughter and daughter against mother, mother-in-law against daughter-in-law and daughter-in-law against mother-in-law. (Luke 12:53) He doesn't stop at family quarrels, He also tells us we will suffer as His followers, Then you will be handed over to be persecuted and put to death, and you will be hated by all nations because of me. (Matthew 24:9) Doesn't really sound like peace does it? #### <u>Lakeside News - Wisconsin Parental Choice Program</u>

At its regular quarterly meeting on November 24, the General Board of Lakeside Lutheran High School approved a recommendation for the school to apply to the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program (WPCP) for 2016-2017. This follows a six month study by an ad hoc committee of the Board of Regents to determine whether Lakeside families might benefit from the WPCP.

The WPCP is a program in which families may apply to the state of Wisconsin to have their student's tuition fully covered. Schools in the program designate the number of seats that they will open each year. Recipients are randomly selected by the state from all eligible applicants to the school. Eligibility is determined by family income and size. Further information on the WPCP is found on the <u>Wisconsin Parental Choice Program</u> page of the Department of Public Instruction's website.

In the coming weeks, Lakeside will pursue the necessary steps for families of its incoming Class of 2020 to be able to apply. Also, students who will enter grades 10-12 next year may apply for the program if they are transferring from a public school. Current Lakeside students are not eligible for the WPCP.

There should be more specifics regarding the application process for the WPCP by mid-January. Check Lakeside's website (www.llhs.org) or call the school (920-648-2321) for for additional information.

Make this flashlight to remember that God, our light, always shows us the way.




#### What you need:

#### **Lutheran Military Support Group**

It was reported a while back that our congregation has become a member of the Lutheran Military Support Group (LMSG). This is a Synod run group and is concerned for the spiritual and physical (especially PTSD help) needs of our active duty members and veterans. Here is a short history of the start up of this group:

In the beginning: Pastor Paul Ziemer, WELS National Chaplain, first conceived the idea of a national parasynodical auxiliary which is independent of, but operates in concert with the WELS Committee for Military Services, and also with the appropriate ELS leadership. As National Chaplain, Ziemer was well positioned to understand the needs for more support for our active duty service members, their families, and veterans within our respective congregations.

**History:** Two years ago, Chaplain Ziemer reached out to several veterans and active duty servicemen around the country whom he had crossed paths with during his ministry. These men formed the first LMSG Board. I believe there were eight of us on that first call. Since we were scattered across several time zones it was an exercise to get everyone on the same page.

This group conferenced twice a month with the top people from the synod's Committee for Military Services when their busy schedules permitted. It took approximately eighteen months to build the strong foundation that the LMSG's governing Board functions under today.

Our good and gracious Lord provided us with just the right man to be our President, Mr. Philip Mowry. Without Phil's legal expertise and steady hand at the wheel, I doubt that LMSG could have navigated the red tape to become a 501c nonprofit with the appropriate bylaws and such. Currently, there are over 60 congregations on board, representing almost 19,000 congregational members.

Now, what does Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church have to do with this? First, we need current information on any member that is on active duty. This is needed whether they are serving stateside or abroad. What is needed is:

- First and last name
- Permanent address (Military families are also supported)
- Branch of service

This information should be given to our liaison, Jeff Krakow, at <a href="krakow.jw@gmail.com">krakow.jw@gmail.com</a> or 920-210-2388 or send to N4252 Oak Grove Drive, Columbus, WI 53925 or you can give it to him in church. We are trying to get the info for our active duty members so our National Chaplain, Pastor Ziemer, can deploy Chaplains or Military Contact Pastors where they are needed.

Second, we would like the same information on all members that are veterans. When sending that information in, please include any needs you may have at this time.
