Apostles: The Replacement

For more than 40 days, the Twelve were actually the Eleven. After Judas "left to go where he belongs" (Acts 1:25), the group chosen by Jesus was left one disciple short. Eleven disciples saw and touched their risen Lord in that locked room in Jerusalem. Eleven watched as Jesus ascended into heaven. Eleven remained afterward in Jerusalem, praying constantly with the other believers.

It was there in Jerusalem that Peter addressed his fellow disciples about the need to find another to take the place of the one who had deserted his post. It was necessary so that the Scriptures would be fulfilled. It was necessary so that there would be another witness of Jesus' resurrection sent out with the rest as an apostle.

So the disciples narrowed it down to two qualified candidates, men who had been with Jesus from the beginning and could testify to his resurrection. Then they prayed and cast lots and found their man: Matthias. The Lord had provided a replacement.

Of course, this was just the start.

One by one—more often by the sword than by sickness or old age—those twelve apostles would come to the end of their ministries. By the time the aged apostle John had died, the age of the apostles was over.

But the Lord's work went on. He continued to raise up preachers and

teachers of his gospel.

In fact, that is his promise to every age. From men like Timothy and Titus to the pastor who baptized you, Jesus has always faithfully provided his church with workers, and he will continue to do so. Lots cast in Jerusalem, votes tallied at a congregational meeting, candidates assigned by synodical leaders—the method may vary but the outcome is the same: the Lord provides public ministers for his church through his church.

What comfort this brings to his people! When a beloved teacher retires, there is no need to worry; the Lord is fully capable of providing someone to take that teacher's place according to his will and wisdom. When a pulpit has been vacant for months, even years, the Lord's sheep gathered in that church know that their Good Shepherd will provide the right under-shepherd at the right time. When a young man takes to the pulpit or podium for the first time, he does so with confidence, knowing that the Lord has chosen and equipped him for this task.

The Twelve are long gone. But their work—the Lord's work—continues. Their message, the good news about the crucified and risen Christ, endures to this day on the pages of Spirit-inspired Scripture. And our living Lord Jesus will continue to raise up workers to proclaim that message until the day he comes again.

<u>Organ Update</u>

The installation of our organ is now complete! Every pipe has been voiced and tuned. So what are we waiting for? We were encouraged by Berghaus Organ Co. to allow a few weeks for the organ to "settle" in case any problems arise. We



want to get those worked out ahead of time so they don't happen during worship. Also, our organists will use these weeks to practice and get used to the changes.

October 25th is the date that was chosen to dedicate our organ and begin using it for worship. A dedication rite will take place at the beginning of our normal 8:00 and 10:30 am services, and then the service will proceed with an emphasis on making music to God's glory. That afternoon at 2:00 pm there will be a concert of hymns and songs to demonstrate the versatility of our instrument. This concert will feature our four regular Zion organists: Rachel Grambsch, Matt Kanzenbach, Kris Kehl and Brady Weiland - as well as Dr. Wayne Wagner from Martin Luther College who served as our consultant throughout this project. Mark October 25th on your calendar. We hope many of you will join us for the unveiling of this instrument of praise!


Make these practical gifts to share blessings with homeless people and others in need.
