Reminded!

"Just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life." Romans 6:4

Why is there a baptismal font in the Chapel of the Christ at Martin Luther College in New Ulm, Minnesota? Did the architects anticipate that a lot of baptisms would be performed on campus? Why is that font located in such a prominent place, just inside the main doors as you enter the chapel? Were those same architects trying to make it inconvenient for people to enter and exit? Why is water constantly flowing from one basin to the next? Is the sound of trickling water supposed to transport students to a serene and peaceful place where they can escape from the stress and demands of their studies?

No, not at all. The baptismal font in the Chapel of the Christ is there because of what we confess in the fourth part of The Sacrament of Holy Baptism in Luther's Small Catechism—The Meaning of Baptism for Our Daily Life:

"What does baptizing with water mean? Baptism means that the old Adam in us should be drowned by daily contrition and repentance, and that all its evil deeds and desires be put to death. It also means that a new person should daily arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.

"Where is this written? Saint Paul says in Romans, chapter 6, 'We were

... buried with [Christ] through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.'"

Daily the baptismal font in the Chapel of the Christ reminds all who pass by it of their own baptisms. We have our reminders too: the fonts in our own churches, the baptismal certificates that may be hanging on our walls, the encouraging words from our parents and sponsors, the empty tomb of Christ. All of them serve as reminders to drown the old Adam in daily contrition and repentance.

Daily we see and confess our sin. Daily we turn to God for forgiveness. Daily we trust in Christ for salvation. Daily we correct whatever wrongs we can. Daily we say no to sin. Daily we hold that stubborn old Adam under water as we live no longer for ourselves but for the One who died for us and was raised again: Jesus Christ (2 Corinthians 5). Even this—this living for Christ, this drowning of our old Adam—is God's doing! He is the one who works in us to will and to act according to his good purpose—by grace and by grace alone.

Elders Board

Paul says he is the worst of sinners. *Here is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the worst.* (1 Timothy

1:15) I believe I could challenge Paul on the distinction of being the worst of sinners, not really a title I want to hold, but it is a reality. If God allowed my sins to be visible sores and infestations on my body, I imagine it would be covered with open sores and the stench of the puss oozing out all over. My clothes would be filthy, torn rags and I would be covered with maggots and lice. Yet, he tells me *he has clothed me with garments of salvation and arrayed me in a robe of his righteousness, as a bridegroom adorns his head like a priest, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels.* (Isaiah 61:10)

Obviously, my body is not perfect in this world's standards. Yet, in God's eyes, I may not be perfect, but I am righteous. *God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.* (2 Corinthians 5:21) He has cleansed me. *Let us draw near to God with a sincere heart and with the full assurance that faith brings, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience and having our bodies washed with pure water.* (Hebrews 10:22) He has done the same for you. He has done this out of his love for us. *For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—* (Ephesians 2:8)

What does he ask in return? Nothing, as we are told in Ephesians. It is a gift of God but he also tells us two verses later. *For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.* (Ephesians 2:10) This is in loving thankfulness for what he has done for us, not to earn anything from him. He also tells us in Micah 6:8. *And what does the LORD require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God.* The greatest answer we have for this is from our Lord. *The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.'* (Mark 12:29b, 30) The only way we can even begin to do this is by the power of the Holy Spirit through Word and Sacrament.

We often use Hebrews 10:25 to encourage church attendance; *not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the*

more as you see the Day approaching. We read verse 22 above, but what do verses 23 and 24 say? *Let us hold unwaveringly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds.* By faith we profess he cleansed our guilty consciences and washed our bodies with pure water, so let's hold onto that and spur one another towards that love he asks of us. Let's encourage one another to read, study, and take to heart God's holy and precious Word. See you in church and Bible study!

What you do:

2. Cover the cardboard with foil. Tape the heart stencil in the center.
3. Fill in the heart "hole" with red paint. Let dry. Remove stencil.
4. Cover your hand with blue paint, and make a handprint to one side of the heart. Cover your friend's hand with green paint and have him or her make a handprint to the other side of the heart. Let dry.

6. On the back, tape twine to make a hanger.
