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Watch Out For Flattened Noses

In a sermon for Thanksgiving Day, Martin Franzmann, Lutheran theologian, professor and preacher, talks about "the perspective of the flattened nose."

"It is this: If God gives us 99 percent good and 1 percent bad, we flatten our nose against that 1 percent. That is what we want to see; we delight in that 1 percent bad, and that is all we can see. We are like a man that has his nose stuck into a dish of ripe limburger – and the whole world stinks" (Ha! Ha! Among the Trumpets, © 1994 Concordia Publishing House, pp. 87-88).

Have we become people with flattened noses? Have we stuck our faces in the limburger? Have we become experts at finding the 1 percent bad while ignoring the 99 percent of God's good blessings? Are we turning into a congregation of whiners, people who are just itching for a reason to be upset and always on the lookout for something new to complain about?

We'd like to answer No; but if we're honest with ourselves we would have to answer Yes. Lately it seems like the complaining has reached a fever pitch, so much so that the topic of complaining was on a recent Church Council meeting agenda. If you believe what many are saying there is nothing right about Zion. "The leaders don't listen to us! We're spending too much money! Our pastors are no good! I don't like the new church!" The litany of lamenting goes on and on and on.

James wrote some strong words about how we use our tongues: "The tongue is a small part of the body, but it makes great boasts. Consider what

a great forest is set on fire by a small spark. The tongue also is a fire, a world of evil among the parts of the body" (James 3:5-6). What damage we can cause with our words! Gossiping, griping and grumbling don't accomplish anything positive. Just the opposite! Such talk discourages your pastors, teachers and lay leaders who work hard, putting in long hours to serve you. Such talk distracts us from our mission of proclaiming the gospel and growing in our faith through Word and Sacrament. Such talk dishonors our gracious God who gives us every good and perfect gift.

It's time to pull our noses out of the limburger and consider our blessings. They are uncountable and undeserved. We have a Savior who took on our flesh, lived and died in our place and rose again to secure our eternity. We have God's holy Word which strengthens our faith in Jesus and guides us in daily living. We have material blessings in abundance. God has not been stingy in giving us our daily bread. We have a well-designed new church in which to hear his Word, receive his Supper and sing his praises. We have a Christcentered school where we are privileged to teach the next generation to fear the Lord. We have each other. We are surrounded by brothers and sisters in Christ, all confessing the same faith, all purchased by the same Redeemer, all privileged to serve him in thanks for his

Truly, "from the fullness of his grace we have all received one blessing after another" (John 1:16). As God's redeemed children we enjoy an embarrassment of riches. Petty complaints and childish whining are

totally out of place for God's people. For these sins we all need to repent. Examine your heart. Confess your sin. Run to the only place forgiveness is found: the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ.

And then "produce fruit in keeping with repentance" (Matthew 3:8). Stop complaining. Avoid negativity. Look for the good in every situation. Use your words to defend others and build them up. Speak positively about your congregation and her ministry. If you see a problem strive to be part of the solution. Encourage your called workers and lay leaders. Pray for them. Thank them. And do all you can to assist them as they do the work of our gospel ministry.

Zion is not a perfect congregation. Such a congregation does not exist. We are all sinners. We do have problems, and we always will. But there is a proper way to deal with them. When you have a legitimate concern, rather than gossiping or complaining about it, humbly bring your concern to one of our leaders, like the church president, councilmen or pastors. They are willing to listen and eager to help.

My friends, watch out for flattened noses. Stay away from the limburger. Instead, join the psalmist to thank God for his abundant daily blessings: "Give thanks to him and praise his name. For the LORD is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations" (Psalm 100:4-5).

As we will be celebrating Reformation Sunday soon, I thought I would include a quote from Martin Luther. On June 26th I was starting the book of Amos and reading the intro, there was a part on Luther's thoughts on Amos. A quote from that reads "people do not repent of the sin or acknowledge it; rather they boast of it and rely upon it as though it were a good deed, as false saints always do. For a sin cannot become more grave, great, or weighty than when it tries to be a holy and godly work, making the devil God and God the devil."

The date of reading that is significant because it was later that day that the Supreme Court ruled that gay marriage was legal. There was much cheering throughout the nation boasting that this was a good deed. People all over were saying the United States is finally showing love. Here is where they try to make a sin "a holy and godly work."

I have been wondering if there are other areas we are trying to make sin a holy and godly work. What about people that boast about golfing or hunting rather than going to church. God never says go to church or go to hell, but He does say "Let us not give up meeting together as some are in the habit of doing." (Hebrews 10:25a) He is not talking about the 19th hole or hunting cabin here. He is talking about gathering around His Word in worship, praise, prayer, and thanksgiving. He also tells us to pay attention to what we are hearing, Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. (James 1:22)

Speaking of thanksgiving, how many of us boast about our material things while giving the Lord our leftovers? He tells us to return our first fruits. Honor the Lord with your wealth, with the firstfruits of all your crops; then your barns will be filled to overflowing, and your vats will brim over with new wine. (Proverbs 3:9-10) He even promises that He will bless us even more when we give our first and best with loving thankfulness. He gives us warning in Haggai "Is it a time for you yourselves to be living in your paneled houses, while this house remains a ruin?" (1:4). Here God is talking about the rebuilding of His temple, but now we are talking about building His Church. Bringing people the Word of the Lord takes money and we are instructed to do just that "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matthew 28:19-20) Notice that He promises to be with us as we go and make disciples. He gives many reasons and Romans 15:4 is just one; For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through endurance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope. We must go and tell of our Savior so more and more people can have and understand the hope that we have. The Lord has blessed us tremendously, how do we thank Him? With the leftovers as we live in our "paneled houses"? He does give us blessings for our enjoyment, but let's use them to God's Glory. All this is for your benefit, so that the grace that is reaching more and more people may cause thanksgiving to overflow to the glory of God. (2 Corinthians 4:15)

I'm sure we could find boasting of worldly things rather than Godly things that go against every commandment (i.e. living together outside of marriage because "everyone" is doing it; taking office supplies from work because they have so much they will never miss this little bit, beside they owe it to me.) May we all listen to His Word, but not merely listen, rather, do what it says.

Gracious Father,

You have given us your word for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness. Help us to understand when we are being corrected and that it is for our own eternal good. Keep us from listening to the prince of this world so we stop boasting of worldly, sinful things. If we are one to boast, may we boast in the Lord! In our Savior's name we pray. Amen.

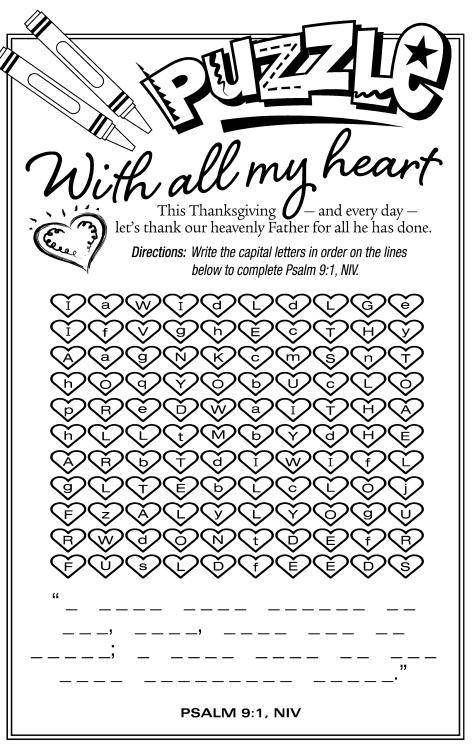
Make table decorations that serve as Thanksgiving conversation-starters.

What you need:

- Paper and pencil
- Scissors
- Cloth or felt
- Needle and thread
- Sewing machine (optional)
- Fiber fill, cotton balls or rice
- Adult help



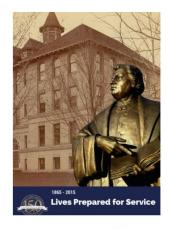
- 1. Cut out a heart pattern (any size) on paper. Allow 1/4" for a seam if you'll be using a sewing machine.
- 2. Cut out material hearts, placing pieces right sides out if sewing by hand and right sides together if using a machine.
- 3. For hand-sewing, use a running stitch or an overcast stitch. Leave an opening for stuffing.
- 4. With a machine, sew along a 1/4" seam, allowing a 1" opening so you can turn the heart inside out and insert stuffing. Trim close to seam but don't cut stitching.
- 5. Fill with stuffing. Sew the opening shut by hand.
- 6. Put a heart at each place setting. Before dinner, have guests pick theirs up and say why they have a thankful heart.
