The Bible is God's Word

The word *Bible* means "books." That's a fitting description since the Bible contains 66 books. They are divided between books of the Old Testament and books of the New Testament.

Some books of the Old Testament are historical books. Others are poetical books. Still others are prophetical books. All of them were written from about 1400 b.c. to 400 b.c. by men such as Moses, David, Isaiah, and Malachi. The major theme of the Old Testament books is God's promise of a coming Savior through the people God had chosen —the Israelites.

The New Testament books, written from about a.d. 40 to a.d. 100, tell us that God has graciously kept his promise. The promised Savior, Jesus Christ, was born in Bethlehem and grew up to take away the sins of the world as God had promised. The first four books of the New Testament record the history of our Savior's birth, ministry, death, resurrection, and ascension into heaven. The book of Acts tells the story of the spread of the early church. The next books of the New Testament are letters written by the apostles to congregations and people who came to believe in Jesus. The last book, Revelation, is a prophecy that describes our Savior's return and his eternal kingdom.

Although all the books of the Bible were written by men, the Bible is not simply a human book. The

Bible is God's Word. The Bible itself testifies repeatedly that God gave the men he chose the very thoughts and words to write. We call the process of God revealing exactly what he wanted these men to write "verbal inspiration."

Sometimes verbal inspiration is misunderstood. Verbal inspiration does not mean that the men who wrote the Bible simply had good ideas they formulated and expounded, like writers of literature today who say they were "inspired." Instead, verbal inspiration means that the men whom God set apart for this special work were writing exactly what God wanted them to write. He used their different positions in life, vocabulary, and styles. Yet what these men wrote did not come from them. What they wrote came from God.

The Bible is God's Word. That's important to remember. It is not merely a compilation of advice from some wise men. The Bible is reliable and true. It is a resource for us when we don't know what direction to take in life or when we struggle with troubling times. The Bible is the Word of our gracious God, the same God who gave his Son to die in our place so that we might live with him forever.

"The LORD himself goes before you and will be with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged." (Deuteronomy

31:8) What an extremely comforting verse, isn't it? Moses was saying this to Joshua as Joshua was about to get the leadership role in Moses' place. Can you imagine how Joshua was feeling? He had some awful big shoes to fill. Moses had just led the Israelites to the edge of the Promised Land and through a number of turbulent times. Now Moses, at 120 years old, was no longer able to lead them and he was also not allowed to cross the Jordan. Moses was assuring Joshua and all of Israel that the Lord would never forsake them.

So what exactly does "forsake" mean? He says "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you." (Hebrews 13:5b) Well, according to Miriam-Webster, it means "to renounce or turn away from entirely". Remember Jesus crying out in a loud voice from the cross, "Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?" (which means "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"). (Mark 15:34) This, by the way, is the only time anyone has ever suffered hell on earth. God turned away entirely from Jesus.

We, however, have the ability to forsake God. He tells us in 1 Chronicles 28:9, through the words of David telling his son Solomon, "And you, my son Solomon, acknowledge the God of your father, and serve him with wholehearted devotion and with a willing mind, for the LORD searches every heart and understands every desire and every thought. If you seek him, he will be found by you; but if you forsake him, he will reject you forever." God does not hide himself from us, but if we forsake, reject, or abandon him, and despise his Word and Sacraments, he will reject us forever.

No matter what you may be going through now or how much trouble you have had in the past, seek him; he will be found by you. He will never leave you nor forsake you. You are not alone. God is with you. Rejoice and join us, around his Word and Sacrament. Receive his blessings in worship, as you give him praise and thanks.

Make this cute, healthy snack for your loved ones on Valentine's Day.




What you need:

- Adult help

At the current rate of contributions to the general fund, Zion is facing a budget shortfall of more than \$200,000 for our 2016-2017 budget year, ending June 30, 2017. While this seems like a huge number, in fact, we can close the gap if each Zion household could increase our firstfruits giving by just 1% of household income. The Stewardship board asks that you prayerfully consider participating in the 1% initiative. If you have been unable to give, please consider if you would be able to start, by giving just 1%.

This worksheet is designed to be a **personal** tool to help determine what your contributions would be with an increase in giving of 1% of your household income – on an annual, and then monthly basis. We will not ask you to share this with anyone. The sole purpose of this worksheet is to help you make an informed and heartfelt decision about your planned giving in 2017.
