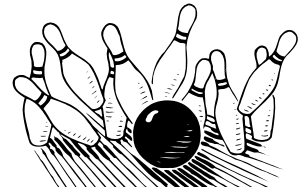

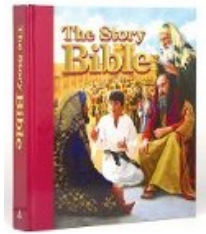

New Church Hearing Loop

The new church building has a system called a hearing loop that has been installed under the flooring in the sanctuary and the fellowship hall that will help those with hearing loss during our worship services and bible studies. What is a hearing loop? A hearing loop, also known as an Induction or Audio Loop, provides a wireless signal that is picked up by the hearing aid when it is set to 'T' (Telecoil) setting. When a hearing aid user selects the 'T' setting; he or she can pick up the sounds spoken into the PA system's microphone instead of the hearing aid's internal microphone. This results in improved speech understanding because the listener receives a clear signal without any background noise. If you would like more information about hearing loops please look at the website www.hearingloop.org.

Also available are portable receivers with an earphone, (similar to the previous system) that can be used and returned to the ushers. If you would like to purchase a receiver of your own please talk to Matt Weidner (920-623-5796) and he can work with you. The receiver would work in any venue that has a hearing loop system installed.

ref·or·ma·tion *n.* 1. the act of reforming or the state of being reformed

re·form *v.* **re·formed, re·forming, re·forms** *v.tr.* 1. To improve by alteration, correction or error, or removal of defects; put into a better form or condition.

Martin Luther is credited with the great reformation of the 16th century and rightfully so. He wanted so bad to reform the Roman Catholic Church. Is reformation still needed today? I say yes. I know that I need to be reformed all of the time. I need to be corrected of my errors; I need defects to be removed; I need to be put into a better condition.

Having said that, I have been corrected, defects removed and put into a better condition by my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. I continue to sin, yet my Father in heaven sees only the righteous man that Jesus made me. Are there others that need a reformation? Again, I say yes. I know we are all sinners. I also know that Jesus died for all of us. That really wasn't Martin Luther's reason for wanting to reform the Roman Catholic Church. His

major concern was what they were teaching and how it was not completely the truth of God's Word.

I was reading another blog by Pastor James Hein. It was about different denominations and why they are different and why people choose different denominations. It is a very interesting article based on the Wesleyan Quadrilateral as he was taught at Seminary. "In simple terms, John Wesley stated that the reason why we all arrive at the theological conclusions that we do is based on what we emphasize as authoritative while we're forming our doctrinal beliefs. There are four pillars that every Christian (and Christian denomination) use to filter their beliefs – 1) the Bible, 2) Tradition/ Church History, 3) Reason, and 4) Personal Experience. Every single Christian church or church body emphasizes these to differing degrees when they establish their beliefs. This understanding of biblical interpretation is *THE* reason why you see so many different denominations out there." (Excerpt from Pastor Hein's blog).

Notice the statement that says "...while we're forming our doctrinal beliefs." This is why I say

there is still a need for reformation. While most Christian denominations (and I'm sure most Christians) have the Bible very high on the list, the other three get varying degrees of emphasis. When we start putting tradition/ church history, reason and personal experience even with or more important than the truths of God's Word some reforming needs to take place. Sometimes what we hear from God's Word is tough on us and maybe gives us a poor personal experience. Sometimes we have to change the way we do things and goes away from our tradition or the way we've always done it. There are times when God's Word doesn't really go with our human reasoning, thank God for that. He is greater than we are and knows all.

Let's thank God for Martin Luther and his reformation. Let's also thank God for Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church and our mission of teaching and preaching God's Word in all of its truth and purity. Most importantly, let's thank God for His Son, our Savior, Jesus Christ and His "reforming" us by His perfect life, innocent death and glorious resurrection to be His children!

Thankful TREE


Make this Thanksgiving decoration and keepsake as a reminder of God's many blessings.

What you need:

- Acrylic paints
- Paint brush
- White cardstock (8" x 11")
- Baby wipes or wet paper towels
- 8" x 11" frame (available at dollar stores)
- Black permanent marker
- Bowls or paper plates


What you do:

1. Paint your palm, fingers, wrist and a portion of your arm with brown paint.
2. With the white cardstock placed vertically, press down your painted hand and arm. The print should resemble a tree trunk and branches.
3. Clean your hand and arm with baby wipes or wet paper towels.
4. Dip your fingertips into different-colored paints and press them onto the paper to make leaves. (It's autumn, so leaves can be falling!)
5. When paint is dry, write "thankful" down the trunk with permanent marker. Also write your name and the year in the corner.
6. Frame and display your decoration.


Praying hands




One way to show our thankfulness is to bow our heads, fold our hands and pray to God.

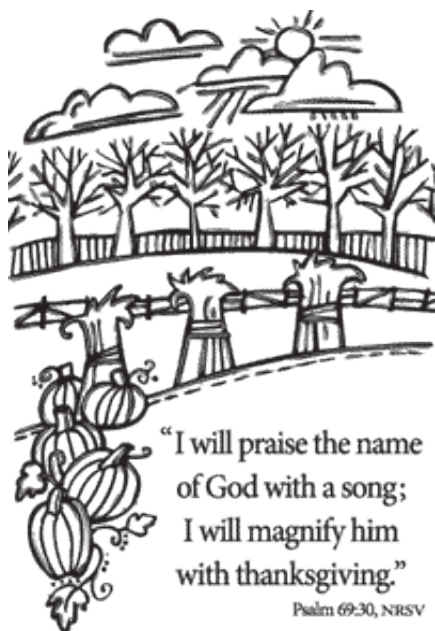
