Apostles: The Rock

Simon was his given name. In a land full of Simons, he was often called Simon son of Jonah. But today, Christians the world over know him better as Peter, the name that Jesus gave him the first time they met.

The name in Greek means "rock" and refers to a movable rock. It would seem to be a fitting title for a solid believer who quickly became the de facto leader of the Twelve. Yet a quick read of the gospels reveals a man who seemed much less than rock steady.

One moment Peter was so full of faith in Jesus that he was willing to try walking on water; the next moment windblown waves washed away that confidence, and he nearly drowned. One minute he gave voice to the divinely revealed truth that is the bedrock foundation of the Church: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Matthew 16:16); the next minute he was the mouthpiece of Satan, trying to dissuade Jesus from suffering and dying. In the Garden of Gethsemane, he stepped forward against an armed mob and swung his sword in a misguided attempt to defend his Savior; but that same night in the courtyard of Caiaphas, he crumbled under the questioning of a servant girl and cursed himself in an unconvincing attempt to deny his Savior. Who is the real Peter?

Just like you and me, Peter was both sinner and saint at the same time. He may have been a bit more outspoken and impulsive than some, but that only gives us a wider window into a heart that looks very similar to ours. Inside each Christian, a constant battle is waging between sinful flesh and Spirit-given faith; the result looks a lot like Peter. Within the same hour, we can both ascend to pinnacles of nobility and sink into pits of evil. In the same conversation, we can both speak by the Spirit and utter devilish ideas. At the same time, our hearts can both trust our Lord and doubt his power.

Where can we find solid ground? The same place Peter did. From the day the Lord gave Peter his name, he taught him where his strength was to be found—not in himself but in the Christ he so beautifully confessed, the Savior who willingly suffered and died for him and for us. When Peter relied on his own strength, he crumbled. When he rested on Jesus, the "living Stone" (1 Peter 2:4), he was like granite.

Let us be rocks hewn from the same quarry, standing strong on the immovable Rock that is Christ.

I wish all of you a very Merry and Christ-filled Christmas and a Happy and Blessed New Year.

As 2014 comes to a close, let's reflect on what the year has been like and look ahead to the enjoyment we can share in 2015. You must admit that 2014 was a very exciting year for Zion. We moved from our old building for worship on Mill Street to our brand new worship facility on Western Avenue. We made it so we could reflect on the old as we enter the new. I would like to reflect back a few more years than just 2014.

There was a time, some years back, that we sang the first two verses of hymn 485 (back then it was number 441) as the offering was brought forward. I'm sure a number of us sang it from heart, but did we really consider the words we were singing?

1. *We give Thee but Thine own,
Whate'er the gift may be;
All that we have is Thine alone,
A trust, O Lord, from Thee.*

2. *May we Thy bounties thus
As stewards true receive
And gladly, as Thou blessest us,
To Thee our first-fruits give!*

We are admitting that everything we have and everything we give is really God's to begin with whatever the gift may be. He trusts us to do what is God-pleasing with it. *Everything good in our lives can be traced directly or indirectly back to the triune God. Flaming sunsets, summer rain, grand canyons, purple mountain majesties--all from him! Our amazing human bodies, families and friends, constantly replenished food supply--all from him! Our spiritual rescue on Calvary; our triumph over sin, death, hell, and Satan; the everlasting home waiting for us--all from him! Lemme hear you! Are you ready for some worship?* (from Time of Grace devotion, December 11)

Then, in verse two, we ask Him to help us gladly take the wonderful and numerous blessings He has given us and return them to Him in proportion to what He has given us. "Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much, and whoever is dishonest with very little will also be dishonest with much. (Luke 16:10) Though this is a very brief explanation of the verses, let's take some time to think about that as we reflect on our previous

giving and also as we prayerfully consider our giving for the future.

One of my sons-in-law said he would prefer we call them tools instead of blessings. His reasoning is that, as sinful human beings, we tend to keep blessings to ourselves, but use tools to help or fix. With that in mind, let's use the blessing of our home as a tool to invite family, friends and neighbors in to a Christ-centered home. Let's also share the blessing of some of our constantly replenished food supply. As we give them some food for their bodies, let's use that time as a tool to feed their soul. Let's use the blessings of a vehicle and our somewhat good health as a tool to visit the straying or unchurched. Let's use the blessing of work as a tool to show a Christ-like attitude which may open a door to share the Gospel Truth. Let's use the blessing of family and friends as a tool to worship together. Let's use the abundant blessing of wealth as a tool to help spread the blessing of triumph over sin, death, hell, and Satan through Jesus Christ our Lord!

Church Building

The final budget for Zion's new church is approximately \$3,122,520.45. Gifts/donations through November 2014 came to \$123,423.19. An additional gift for the new church recently came in at \$8,500.00.

\$35,000.00 was allocated on the budget for assistance by Rketek with the project. Marty Sell wrote me last week and said he is not charging for his assistance with the project. That was great news and a generous donation that will be used for overages on the project.

The total amount borrowed from American National Bank is \$1,996,443.07. Monthly payments to American National Bank will be \$9,246.76.

After the final new church invoices are paid there will be approximately \$220,000.00 of funds remaining in the New Church & School Savings and Checking accounts.

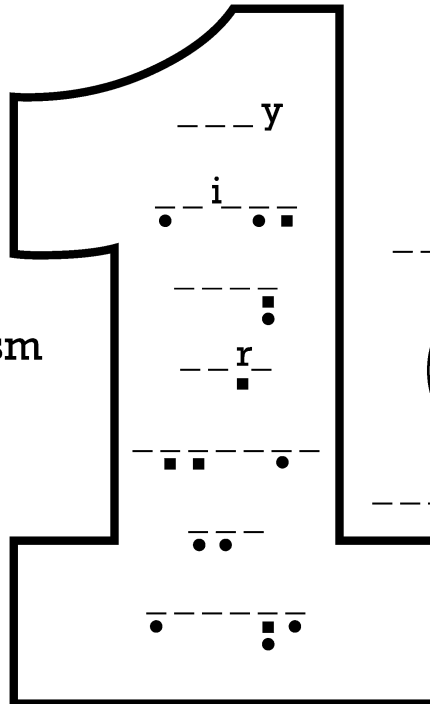

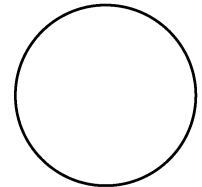

PASTORAL LETTER

Read to the congregation on Sunday, December 14, 2014.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Another call has come and gone. A month of prayers and conversations, emails and letters is at an end. What a testament to the grace of God that a sinful man like me is allowed to consider not just one but two invitations to serve Jesus in gospel ministry! What a privilege it is to remain here at Zion serving you all with God's powerful Word and Holy Sacraments! The call to Petoskey has helped me to appreciate the many blessings I and my family have here at Zion. Right now hundreds of those blessings are seated before me.

The call to Petoskey, like all divine calls, has helped me in another way. It has given me the opportunity to think about our ministry and to crystalize in my mind some issues that I believe need our prayerful consideration. I'll call them the three M's – Momentum, Mission and Maturity.

Momentum

Let's talk about momentum. Right now is an exciting time at Zion. After many years of hard work we have completed our new building. Because of this it is also a dangerous time at Zion. Now that the building is up, the pews are in place and the dishes are put away in the pantry we are tempted to sit back, breathe a sigh of relief and relax for a while. Now is not the time for a siesta. Now is the time to put the pedal to the metal. A friend of mine aptly described our new church as a "launch pad" for our ministry. Now that we have this beautiful, accessible, functional, Christ-centered building on the same campus as our school the time is ripe for gospel ministry. As our Savior said, we need to work while it is day (John 9:4-5) or as the farmer says, to make hay while the sun shines. There is nothing wrong with enjoying the fruit of our labors – or more accurately, the fruit of God's gracious blessing. But I can think of no better way to enjoy this new church than using it for aggressive gospel ministry to both Zion members who know Jesus as their Savior and to those in our community who don't. It's time for us to get to work!

Mission

Let's talk about mission. I don't put much stock in rumors. However, as I deliberated the call word got back to me that I would never take the call to Petoskey because we just built the new church. Let me assure you: I did not stay because of this building. I stayed for mission and ministry. Our mission is clear: Proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ. Baptize and teach. Make disciples. But how do we go about doing that? What's the best way to use the time, talent and treasure the Lord has entrusted to this little body of Christ in Columbus for gospel ministry? Those are questions that we dare never stop asking. To help us examine our ministry and carry out our mission, we will soon begin a six-month self-assessment, goal-setting and planning process. Your input will be important in this process. We will work hard to grow in those areas where we identify weaknesses and to build on our God-given strengths. It's still all about excellence for Christ. In gratitude for our Lord's forgiving love let's give him our very best!

Maturity

Let's talk about maturity. I'm getting older. Hair is going away in places I want it, but showing up in places I don't. My hearing and vision aren't getting any better. There are bifocals in my future. And the battle of the bulge is no longer just an interesting piece of World War II history about which I enjoy reading. As I grow older am I getting wiser? I wonder. We need to grow. All of us. Including yours truly. It's amazing how many of our congregational and personal problems can be traced back to a simple lack of maturity, a basic failure to grow. Hurt feelings, budget deficits, missed opportunities, poor attendance, ruined marriages, lost friendships, broken families, apathy, greed, materialism – all come back to a failure to “grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ” (2 Peter 3:18). I am convinced that we need to redouble our efforts to do just that. God has given us powerful tools for our growth – his Word and Sacraments. It is my prayer that through well-planned, Christ-centered worship, well-prepared Bible studies, habitual Bible reading and frequent family devotions we will all grow in Christian faith and godly living. Of course, these things don't just happen. We must preach and teach and encourage, plan and prepare, train and model. And we have to do this together. We must hold one another accountable. May God fill each of us with a desire to grow in the Word and to help others do the same.

So that's it. My big speech. I thought it was important to lay before you the kinds of things that were keeping me up at night for the past few weeks as I deliberated. Now it's your turn to deliberate a bit. Think about momentum, mission and maturity. Pray about these issues. The Spirit will bless you every moment you do!

Again, I want you to know that I consider it a privilege to remain here in Columbus as your pastor. I am excited to continue serving with my brother, Pastor Wilke, with our excellent faculty, our dedicated leaders, and with all of you, my dear partners in ministry. Let's get to work. And let's remember for whom we work and why: It's all about the glory of our Savior-God!

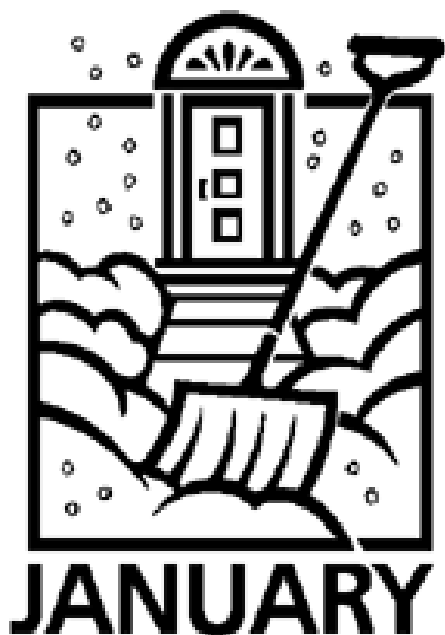
