Connected!

***"We were therefore buried with him through baptism."
Romans 6:4***

We sing it every spring, usually on Good Friday, and maybe during a midweek Lenten service. "Were you there?" Nope. I wasn't there when they crucified my Lord. I wasn't there when they nailed him to the tree. I wasn't there when they laid him in the tomb. And yet, I was there. And so were you. No, not physically. No, not as a witness. "Don't you know," Paul asks us in Romans 6:3, "that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?" We were also, then, buried with him through Baptism, weren't we?

Think about what that means.

Baptism connects us to Christ. Baptism connects us to his crucifixion. Baptism connects us to his suffering. Baptism connects us to his death. Baptism connects us to his burial. When Christ was crucified, it was as though we had been crucified. When Christ suffered, it was as though we had suffered. When Christ died, it was as though we had died. When Christ was buried, it was as though we had been buried. Baptism connects us to Christ.

Why does a sports fan say, "We didn't play very well" or "We didn't have our heads in the game" even though the team was some 500 miles away and the fan was sitting on the couch in his living room? Why does a sports fan use terms like *we* and *us* when talking about a football team's performance even though "we" never put on a helmet or stepped onto the field? Because we have a connection to that team! We

don't have to be alumni to be connected to our team. We don't have to be former players to feel our team's pain or to celebrate its victories. Local pride connects us to our team. Geographical roots connect us to our team. Grandma and Grandpa, Mom and Dad, connect us to our team. The team's loss is our loss. The team's win is our win.

Baptism connects us to Christ. His punishment was our punishment. His suffering was our suffering. His death was our death. "He was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed" (Isaiah 53:5). We were buried with Christ through Baptism. Baptism connects us to Christ and to his death that paid for our sin. We are connected to Christ not because of who we are or because of what we have done, but because of who Christ is and because of what he has done. We are connected to Christ by grace and by grace alone.

Our March 3rd meeting is fast approaching. Kris Kehl will be at this meeting to accompany us so we can sing some of our favorite hymns. We will then have our regular business meeting.

Elders Board by Jeff Krakow

Do you ever feel that God is not near to you? Or, maybe you feel God is no longer listening to you? Maybe the answer to these questions is that you are no longer near to or listening to God.

Let's look at Song of Songs (some versions title it Song of Solomon) chapter 5. This is Solomon's love story, the best of songs, and chapter 5 has a little bit of separation between the bride and groom. We know from other parts of scripture that Christ refers to Himself as the Bridegroom that will return to take His bride (us) home.

Again, we are looking at chapter 5. Verse 2 starts with the bride either half asleep or, sleeping but dreaming. Then her lover knocks on the door and asks her to open. She thinks it's too much bother to get dressed and answer the door, besides; she has already washed her feet and doesn't want to get them dirty again.

Does that sound like something you might do? Revelation 3:20 says: ***Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with that person, and they with me.*** What is your response to that? Are you too sleepy to open the door of church and walk in? Is it too much bother to get dressed to hear His Word?

Back to the love story; verse 5 says she finally decided to open the door and her lover was no longer there. We read later that he left, not because he was angry, but because he felt rejected. Are you rejecting Jesus? Will you continue to wait to open the door for Him? He has a warning for you: ***"I am going away, and you will look for me, and you will die in your sin.*** (John 8:21).

I pray we all get up and answer the door. We all get dressed and listen to His Word and take it to heart. He assures us of His presence; ***"Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you."*** (Hebrews 13:5) He does not leave you; you leave Him. Some leave by literally walking away. Others leave Him by not coming to Him in worship and Bible study. Maybe you have the feeling that God is not listening because you feel your life is not going well. Again, maybe you have stopped listening to God, or maybe you are listening but not hearing clearly. He says, ***"Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned."*** (Mark 16:16) He also tells us that we will have trouble in this world; ***In this world you will have trouble.*** But, He follows it with some very comforting words; ***But take heart! I have overcome the world."*** (John 16:33) So, whatever troubles you are having, Christ has overcome! He again assures us of this comfort with these beautiful words: ***And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.*** (Romans 8:28) So whatever you are going through, as a believer in Jesus Christ as your Savior, you are assured it will work out for your eternal good.

We are hearing right now, through this season of Lent, just how God has overcome the world. He has given us eternal life by living a perfect life in our place, dying an undeserved death on the cross, and rising to eternity with the Father, assuring us the resurrection to eternity with Him. This was the first irony that we heard about; the cross that was the symbol of death is our symbol of life. Come often and hear of that great exchange that God has given to us freely; His suffering and death for our eternal life in heaven, ***For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.*** (John 3:16)

By the way, if you peek into chapter six, you will see that Solomon's love song goes well as verse 3 states ***I am my beloved's and my beloved is mine.*** We also can rejoice as we are Christ's and He is ours. We have been clothed with His righteousness, ***for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ.*** (Galatians 3:27)

Father in Heaven,

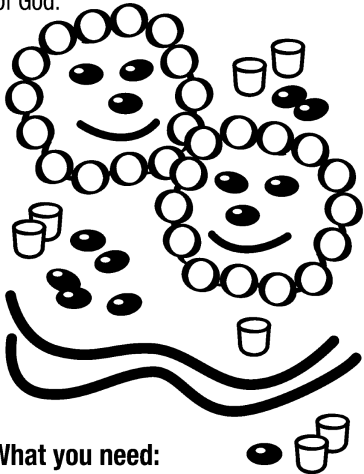

What you do:

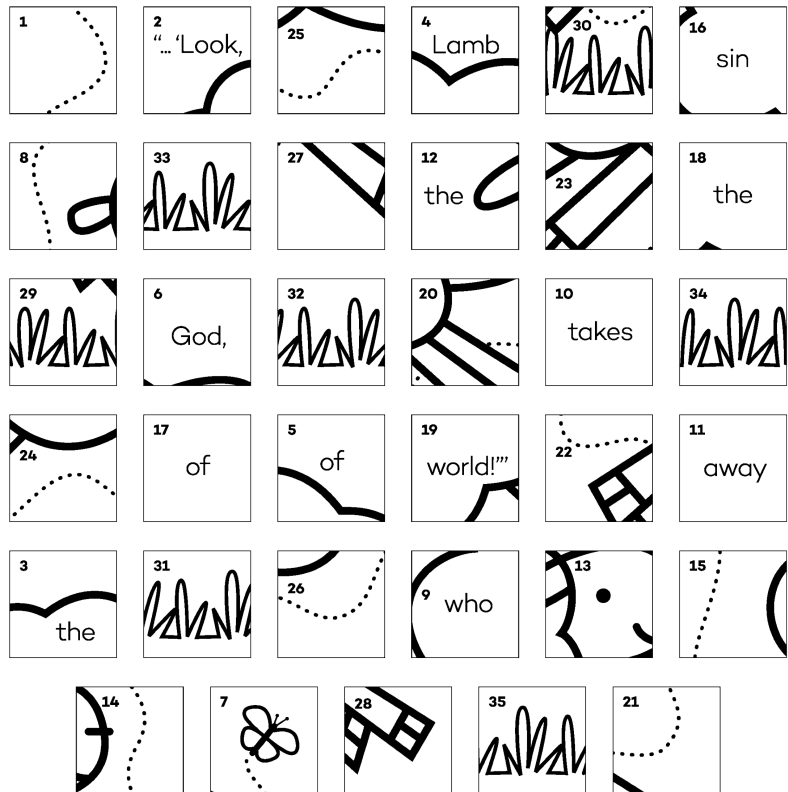
1. Bake and frost the cupcakes.

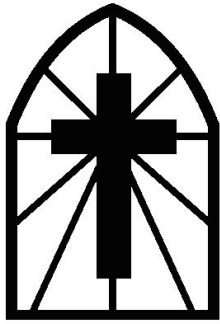
