Washed!

“Get up, be baptized and wash your sins away.” Acts 22:16

I don't know who he was. He was standing next to me at one of the sinks in the restroom of a fast-food restaurant. The water was running. His hands were completely covered in a white, soapy lather. I've never seen someone wash his hands so frantically—scrubbing and scrubbing as though his hands would never become clean. Without even looking up at me—taking a break from his scrubbing only to rinse his hands so that he could apply more soap—he said, “No germs here.” I don't know if he was being sarcastic about the cleanliness of the restroom or if he was referring to the general cold and flu season that we were in or if he was verbally patting himself on the back for how thoroughly he had washed his hands.

Reminders to wash our hands are everywhere. Moms say it to their children throughout the day, before every meal, and after they use the bathroom. Hands are tough to keep clean. They can be covered with dirt and grime we can see (just ask a mechanic or a five-year-old boy), or they can be covered with germs and bacteria we can't see (just ask the school nurse or that guy who was washing his hands in that restroom).

Wouldn't it be great if we could change the oil in the car or work in the garden and not have to spend time and effort trying to get our hands clean? Okay, I understand that's a bit foolish. But there is a dirt

that is far more messy than mud. And there is a germ that is far more deadly than bacteria. No amount of scrubbing could ever wash away our sin. There isn't a soap strong enough to remove the guilt that is embedded deep within our hearts.

But there is a washing that makes us clean and that keeps us clean. There is a washing that eliminates our need to scrub and scrub. At the baptismal font. With water that's not just plain water. With water that is used by God's command and that is connected to his Word. Baptism is the shortest bath we've ever had but it is the bath that's made us the cleanest we'll ever be! At the baptismal font the Holy Spirit scrubbed away the dirt of disobedience, the scum of disrespect, the grime of dishonor, and the mud of every sinful thought, word, and deed: washed, erased, cleansed, baptized. God did it. He did it all by grace and by grace alone.

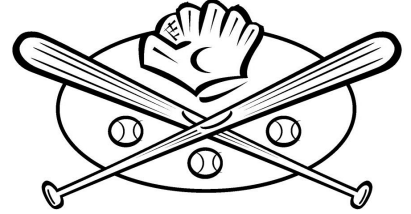

It is finished. What beautiful and comforting words. It is finished. There is nothing we need, or even can, do. It is finished. Jesus took all of our sins, all the sins of all mankind for all time, upon Himself. It is finished. He took the punishment we deserve, the beating, the thorns in His head, the nails through His hands and feet, the suffering of hell - separated from God's love, the death, the piercing. It is finished. He did it all because of His love for us. It is finished. Our sins are forgiven.

Sadly, there are those among us, family, friends, neighbors that reject this gift. There are some who, for whatever reason, think they need to have some part in their salvation. Jesus said it is finished and so it is.

My devotion book this year is written by a Marine that served in the Korean Conflict. I would like to quote from the devotion for March 21 based on Philippians 3:18-20: *For, as I have often told you before and now tell you again even with tears, many live as enemies of the cross of Christ. Their destiny is destruction, their god is their stomach, and their glory is in their shame. Their mind is set on earthly things. But our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ.* The Public Information Officer (who happened to be a priest) was asked about the spiritual state of the soldiers. I quote:

"He said:

'It reflects directly the spiritual health of the nation. The good are very good; the careless are very careless. War has awakened a number of men to the question of their own destiny and eternal salvation. But even war has failed to do so for some.'

The priest's words are timeless and thought provoking. In my case, a war did awaken me to questions of my destiny, but not to the matter of eternal salvation. I think this is what Father O'Connor means by "careless." If a person is not seeking answers or thinks he has the answers, he is indeed on a careless path. To go along in life thinking one is the master of his fate requires a callous disregard for the realities of the world we live in. I unfortunately had to go a long way before finally realizing I was not as good a person as I thought I was, and that I was also incapable of making myself better. It shouldn't take a war to awaken us to our need for forgiveness and a change of heart. We know we have a God who hears us, forgives us, and has a divine destiny in store for each of us. Carelessness is not an option."

May we all be awakened to our need for forgiveness and a change of heart. Let's not be comfortable with the spiritual milk we learned as little children, but desire to dig deeper into God's Word, hearing His truth, learning it, taking it to heart, to have a defense when the prince of this world, the devil, tempts us into thinking we are the masters of our fate.

Dear Savior God,

You sent your Son to be born of a woman, to be born under the law, to redeem those under the law. Your Son, when the set time had fully come, took the punishment we deserve and saved us from sin, death, the devil, and eternal condemnation. In return for taking our sins, He gives us free salvation and eternal life with you. Help each and every one of us understand your tremendous love for us and in turn love you with all of our heart, soul, mind, and strength and love our neighbor as ourselves.

As we at Zion look forward to the 2016-2017 school year with excitement, we recognize a growing need of many families who learn and praise with us every day at Zion School. A growing number of families have indicated a need for assistance with paying tuition for their children to attend Zion. In years past, we have supported this need with tuition received from the K4 program at Zion. At this time we expect, however, the amount of aid requested to be granted for the 16-17 school year to exceed the amount of aid available. We can no longer support this program with funding in this manner. As many of you may be aware, Zion does use the FACTS program: but this is merely used to calculate need for tuition assistance, not to actually fund the program.

We ask any members that are willing and able to help us in this cause to contribute to the tuition assistance program at Zion School. Every extra bit of contributions will be greatly appreciated. While we are also aware that tuition has increased this year, this may prove an extra burden to families already requesting assistance. Please prayerfully consider donating to this fund so that we may continue to provide this service to families in need.

While direct contributions are certainly appreciated, another means to increase funding to this program is by making purchases through the Scrip program, in which Zion school receives a certain donated percentage from each purchase made.
