Covered!

"All of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ." Galatians 3:27

It was mid-November. His yard looked awful. The grass was brown; it had gone dormant. But even when it was green it hadn't been very lush. The yard had its share of bare spots. After a hard rain, those bare spots had become puddles of mud. The leaves that had been swirling around his vard for weeks were now bunched up in various piles along the fence. The same swirling wind had also taken all of the debris from the neighborhood and wedged it into the leafless branches of his dying bushes. His yard was an ugly mess; it was an embarrassing sight.

Overnight, however, it snowed. Six inches of beautiful snow now covered that ugly mess. His yard was suddenly beautiful; it actually was a sight to see: picturesque, peaceful. His yard was covered with a uniform layer of glistening brilliance. Rolling mounds of white snow covered the trash in the bushes, the piles of leaves along the fence, the puddles of mud, and the dormant grass. Every tree branch popped in the sun as though someone had traced each limb with a white highlighter. Only he knew what was still underneath that snow -his ugly, brown, dead, trash-filled yard.

My life isn't beautiful. My life displays the brown grass of a love that all too often goes dormant, the bare spots of my awful failures to help a neighbor in need, and the muddy puddles of doubt and worry that I tend to wallow in. My life is littered with the trash of my hate-

filled thoughts, my hurtful words, and my self-absorbed actions that swirl around and eventually pile up on my conscience. The sins I commit day in and day out truly are an embarrassing sight. I can hardly bear to look at them. I shudder to think what God must think when he looks at me.

And yet, what does God see when he looks at me? Not me. Not my sin. But like a blanket of fresh, white snow, he sees only the righteousness of his Son. "All of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ" (Galatians 3:27). In Baptism Jesus covered me with his obedience. What does my heavenly Father see when he looks at me, one of his own baptized children? No stain. No wrinkle. No blemish. Despite the sins I commit, robed in Christ, I stand holy and blameless before him (Ephesians 5). With the gentle sprinkling of water in Holy Baptism. God covered all of our sins —he covered all of us—with Christ, by grace and by grace alone.

We are coming upon confirmation and it reminded me of a blog my son-in-law uses. I thought this would be an appropriate time to share this particular blog post:

Rated Teen? I just saw this morning that my Bible app is rated "Teen". Really? I suppose...it has prostitution, rape, homosexuality, murder...but should my children wait until they are teenagers to start reading the Bible?

NO WAY!

The problem with our world's rating system is that it only looks for the mere occurrence of these sinful actions. It doesn't look at how these sinful actions are addressed or how these sinful actions run into serious consequences. The Bible shows the true result of following your sinful desires...death, or in less severe cases, some form of dying (i.e. disease, broken relationships, hardening of hearts, being apart from God). The real problem is the stuff we let our children watch and read (also rated Teen), but tells lies, disconnecting the sinful behaviors from their natural consequences.

They read about sex with multiple people and hear about how fun it is, but never hear about the deep pit of loneliness and insecurity you sink into by still being alone outside of marriage. "The Lord God said, 'It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him.'... That is why a man leaves his father and mother and is united to his wife, and they become one flesh."

They see homosexuality, and never hear that they "received in themselves the due penalty for their error."

They watch dramatized stealing where the master thief gets away, and then believe that there are certain situations where it is OK to steal, where we judge others unworthy of what we should have (this is so common even without encouragement). But God described how true Christians should act when He gave us the commandments. "You shall not commit adultery," "You shall not murder," "You shall not steal," "You shall not covet." Whatever other commands there may be are summed up in this one command. "Love your neighbor as yourself."

They see all the fun they can have with "stuff", but don't see that it never really satisfies, and leaves you groping for more. You can't have it, because God says, "the world is mine, and all that is in it." Take delight in the Lord, and he will give you the desires of your heart.

They hear the funny jokes about the dumb, close-minded religious people, and never hear, "For the Lord watches over the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked leads to destruction."

They even watch thousands of commercials, not showing the true quality of the product, but eye candy, things not even remotely connected to the products, lying to them of a better experience than reality (no wonder we doubt everything anyone says). What will they get into if they don't know to "above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it. And go to God so that the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

The Bible might be rated "Teen", but it's also rated Adult, Child, Man, Woman, Sinner, Saint, Parent, Grandparent...well, I guess you could just say rated "E" for Everyone (but that's not as dramatic).

I just read an article that says for the first time in history, the Bible is in the top ten of most challenged books. The list is comprised of books the public has most often requested be removed from libraries. Is it because we keep it from our children? Is it because we feel once we are confirmed, we know everything and no longer read God's Word? Let's get back to making the Bible rated "E" for Everyone and get it to be the #1 requested book to KEEP in libraries.

A heartfelt felt heart


On Mother's Day, express your love for your mom or another special woman by giving her this gift from the heart.

What you need:

- Red felt (8" x 11" sheet)
- Dark pen
- Fabric scissors
- Pillow stuffing
- Straight pins
- Embroidery thread (pink, red or black)
- Needle
- An adult to help

What you do:
