### **Meet the New Pastor**

### Where did you grow up? Where did you go to school?

I was born in Minnesota and grew up in a town on the Mississippi River called St. Paul Park. There were about 5,000 people in the town and it was a short drive from our state capital. Sound familiar? I'm looking forward to my children experiencing the same type of environment in which I grew up.

For school, I spent PreK-8th Grade in St. Andrew's Lutheran School of St. Paul Park, MN. My High School was St. Croix Lutheran High School of West St. Paul. I was in the last graduating class of Northwestern College (class of 1995). I graduated from Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary in 1999.

What kind of jobs did you have before you went into the ministry?

Mainly summer jobs to pay for school. I've worked in farm fields and a grocery store, managed a go-kart track and had a stint as a Zamboni driver. By far, my most rewarding was four years at a moving company, Bester Brothers, of South St. Paul. The people with whom I was employed worked hard and laughed hard. We were able to serve people at a time of high-stress in their life. Expect lots of "moving" illustrations in future sermons and bible classes.

How did you and Niki get together? We met in college back when our synod operated two different ministerial colleges. She went to Dr. Martin Luther College and I went to Northwestern in Watertown. Her first call was to Yale, MI. We dated long distance until we got married before my vicar year. (1997)

Why did you go into the ministry? It's amazing how God uses people in your life to lead you where he wants you to go. There has never been a lightning bolt or a vision from heaven saying, "Thou shalt..." There have just been a long line of encouraging parents, friends, teachers and others who said, "I could see you as a pastor. You should give it a try." I did. I ended up with a

great, encouraging roommate in college, a good experience in college and seminary and here I am. I stay in the ministry because that excitement that comes when someone reacts to the gospel with faith... especially for the first time... never gets old.

### Tell us about your ministry experience.

I vicared at St. Paul's Lutheran Church of Tomah, WI and at St. John's Lutheran Church of Wauwatosa. My call on assignment day of 1999 was to an exploratory mission in Roswell, NM. (Yes, THAT Roswell. Expect a few illustrations involving aliens as well). In 2004 I received and accepted the call to serve as the pastor of Redeemer in Yakima, where we have been until the present day.

There is not a lot of green and gold on your car. What went wrong?

My dad was born in Green Bay and raised me as a Packer fan until I turned eight years old. A friend and I then started watching the Cowboys on TV and would go out in the back yard and pretend to be Tony Dorsett and Danny White and it just stuck. I married a diehard Packer fan from New Berlin and one of our sons is a Cheesehead as well. As long as they aren't playing my team, I cheer for the Pack.

### What are you going to miss about WA?

Hiking in the mountains, Pacific Northwest IPA's, climbing in the mountains, Rainier cherries off of the trees and driving through the mountains on our way to the ocean. Most importantly, we've had some wonderful people whom we have gotten to know and love over our last twelve years. We look forward to getting to know and love people in the same way at Zion and in Columbus.

Do you plan on making any big changes at Zion once you are here? I plan on preaching the gospel. That always changes people.



The officer in charge of the Ammo Line stated that he heard a voice behind him saying "PRAISE THE LORD AND PASS THE AMMUNITION". He turned and saw Chaplain Lt. Howell Forgy moving down the line patting the men on the back and making that remark to cheer the men on. The officer stated that hearing the Chaplain helped him keep going. ### Elders Board by Jeff Krakow

Summer time! What fun! Time for baseball, swimming, vacations, relaxing! But, is it a time to take vacation from God's Word? In the past we have seen our worship attendance go down during the summer. In an effort to find out what God says about this, I went to a Bible app and keyed in the word "vacation" so I could find everything his Word says about it. The only problem is "vacation" is not mentioned once in the Bible.

Not wanting to do just that one search, I typed a word I knew I would find, "rest". In the app I was using "rest", or a form of it (including restitution and restore), was found 508 times in the NIV 2011. The rest God talks about is rest for our souls, an eternal rest with him. Before we receive our eternal rest, he gives us rest with the forgiveness of our sins. If we take a vacation from his Word, how do we find that rest? We won't because that rest is only found in the Gospel in Word and Sacrament.

The work of our Elder's Board is to find opportunities for the congregation to gather in Word and Sacrament, and to dig deeper into his Word through Bible Studies. We try to make sure there are as many opportunities as possible for you to attend worship each week. We look for opportunities for Bible Study that would accommodate people's schedules. This is also why we write these words of encouragement every month. However, we cannot do it alone. We all are to not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching. (Hebrews 10:25) I'm sure all of us know someone who is neglecting God's Word by their lack of attendance in worship. Encourage them! Sometimes, your actions are the encouragement they need. By your consistent attendance in worship and Bible Study, they may be encouraged to join you. Sometimes it takes more than actions. You might have to actually use words. Encourage one another!








### What you need:

In the Lakeside Lutheran federation, we're blessed to have choices for high school. Choices bring questions. Can we answer yours? We asked some new graduates—we like to call them "Forever Warriors"— toward the end of their high school years, to think about and offer some answers to questions they remember having before their families made the choice for a Lakeside Lutheran high school education. What other questions do you have? We'd appreciate the opportunity to have the conversation.

Q: How would I get to and from LLHS on a daily basis? A: There are many different ways to get to school. One is the Lakeside bus service, offering seven different bus routes. Within these routes, there are 50 different pick-up points. These bus routes cover 439 miles a day! 85% of students use the bus service. If students do not bus, they carpool, have a parent drive them, or drive themselves. They are willing to travel these distances for the quality Christian education that Lakeside offers. Q: What extracurriculars are offered other than sports? A: There are many activities other than sports. Students have opportunity to expand skills and experience outside of the classroom, gym or field in journalism, music, technology, photography and videography, agriculture, communication, drama, leadership, event planning, service and more. Through God's blessings, many extracurrics see tremendous success. Warrior Forensics and the Math team have won conference championships for several years straight, even State championships. Our award-winning newspaper is a rare weekly! Lakeside FFA offers many opportunities to those interested in all forms of agriculture. (Annah Dobson, Immanuel, Farmington)

Q: Is it hard to meet new friends? A: Being worried about this big transition is very normal for all new students wherever they may go, but there are many ways to make friends at LL. By being involved in extracurriculars a student is more likely to meet other people with common interests. As cliche as it sounds, staying true to oneself is the best way for students to make friends, and LL makes it easier for young Christians to live their faith. Here students are surrounded by their brothers and sisters in Christ. This creates a comfortable and safe environment to make friends who often last a lifetime. (Nora Stake, Eastside, Madison)

Q: What if I'm in after-school activities? Must my parents pick me up every day? A: Being involved in activities not only looks impressive on college applications, but it's an excellent way to develop friendships. However, going to a school 40 minutes away may make it difficult. Fortunately, at Lakeside, there are many people who travel the same distance. One of the most popular traveling options for students is to carpool with others who live in their area. This gives students the opportunity to be involved outside of school and develop new relationships. (Kendal Denson, Peace, Sun Prairie, Robbie Jarnigo, St. Paul, Lake Mills & Noah Kooiman, St. John, Newville)

Q: Is financial aid available? A: Through God's grace the opportunity to apply for financial aid is available to students. In order to apply for financial aid parents will need to fill out a form online when applying for school. In 2015-16, 22% of Lakeside students shared a total of \$102,700 in financial aid. In 2016-17, LLHS begins its first year in the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program, which allows income eligible families to choose Christian education and have tuition paid for with state dollars. Q: Are there "hands-on" classes where I learn by doing? A: There are many opportunities for "hands on" learning. In our Tech and Career Ed area, we offer 3 levels of Woods, Welding, Small Engines, Construction and an Agricultural survey class. We also have four levels of art, along with sewing and foods. LLHS also offers a wide variety of strength and fitness classes. (Tucker Nass, Trinity, Watertown & Matt Werre, Peace, Sun Prairie)

Q: Do many LLHS students get scholarships to colleges and tech schools? A: With its strong academic curriculum and faculty who facilitate deep learning, Lakeside students overall place in the top 3% statewide in the ACT, a college-readiness exam that plays a strong role in scholarship granting. Through this and strong school and community involvement and leadership, LLHS graduates have received over \$4 million in scholarships over the past four years. (Jonathan Olah, Holy Cross, Madison & Aaron Petersen, St. Paul, Lake Mills).


