#### **Apostles: The Unknowns**

What do you know about Thaddaeus, James son of Alphaeus, and Simon the Zealot? Not much? Don't feel bad. While the better known trio of Peter, James, and John is mentioned frequently in Scripture, we find precious little recorded there regarding these other three.

All we know for sure about this particular James is that his father was named Alphaeus; his mother may have been one of the Marys who visited Jesus' tomb. We know very little about Thaddeus other than that he is also called Judas or Jude. Simon's name gives us plenty about which to speculate: the Zealots were a radical, nationalistic group to which this disciple evidently belonged before Jesus called him. But Scripture relates nothing specific about his activities before or after meeting Jesus.

In other words, all we really know about these men is their names.

But so what? While these three men may be mostly unknown to us, what matters is that they were known by Jesus, who called them and taught them and sent them out just as he did the other disciples. That their words and deeds remain largely shrouded in mystery does not mean they were insignificant; the Holy Spirit simply chose not to share those details with us. The fact that these men don't have many churches named after them doesn't mean they were any less important than the rest of the Twelve.

That's comforting to know because, in the grand scheme of things, most of us will fade away into the same obscurity. Chances are good that centuries from now all that will be known about most of us will be our names, typed into public records or engraved on tombstones. It's easy to think that this makes us less important than a famous apostle or even a well-known person from our own era. We can begin to feel that our work as mothers and millworkers means less than that of ministers and missionaries.

But nothing could be further from the truth. The value of our deeds depends not on how notable they are but on the simple fact that they flow from faith. We are defined not by how many people remember us here on earth but by who knows us in heaven. The same Savior who called James, Thaddaeus, and Simon to follow him has done the same for us. The same Spirit who equipped and empowered the Twelve fills us with faith and fervor. We may be unknowns to most of the world, but not to our Father in heaven. He knows us from eternity and has written our names in his book of life.

In the end, if that's the only place they are ever written, that's enough!

#### **Elders Board** by Jeff Krakow

Last month I wrote about how God puts many "evangelizing" opportunities right in front of us (family, friends, co-workers, etc.). I pray you have taken advantage of such opportunities. However, I do know that many avoid discussing their faith.

Basically, there are three reasons for this: first, it's divisive, we may lose a friendship; second, we're nervous, they may ask us a question we cannot answer; third, since they don't follow Jesus, we lack the shared experience that things like sports easily provides so, we wonder if we have any common ground. Each of these reasons breaks down. First, since we are a believer in Jesus as our Savior, eventually people will find out. They will see us rush out of our house every Sunday, or see us carrying our Bibles to a mid-week Bible Study, or seeing our Christian friends coming over for a Bible Study in our house. Second, when (not if) they ask us a question we cannot answer, we have two viable options. We can guess and/or answer from our own experiences. Or, we can be humble and say "I'm not real sure of that specific element of faith." Then find the answer and honor them by following up. Third, we may lack the shared element of faith, but we're normal human beings, so we likely have plenty to talk about.

It takes great faith to share the gospel: it is <u>divisive</u> – God promises it to be **Everyone will hate you because of me, but the one who stands firm to the end will be saved.** (Mark 13:13), and others will consider our belief foolish **For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.** (1 Corinthians 1:18). It <u>can</u> make us nervous – they may not respond well; they might laugh at us. And it <u>is</u> intrusive – the cross draws a line between beliefs. Such is Christian experience, across time and throughout the world. But the faith by which Paul and the righteous live isn't faith in others' perspective of us, or the relationship we have with them. It's faith in a far greater God than those idols. And that faith caused Paul – and causes us – not to be ashamed of the gospel. **For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes: first to the Jew, then to the <b>Gentile.** (Romans 1:16). (Much of the preceding two paragraphs are taken from the book "A **Field Guide for Everyday Mission"** by Ben Connelly and Bob Roberts, Sr.)

It isn't always easy to talk to others, especially religion and politics. Not all of us have been given the gift of preaching, whether in the called ministry or as a lay person calling on the straying or unbelievers, but God does call us to spread the good news. He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation. (Mark 16:15) He says this to all of us, whether we are young or elderly. If He has not given you the gift of preaching, He has given you other gifts to spread that good news, use that gift.

#### **ZION BUDGET 2015-2016**

Included in this months Messenger is the 2015 - 2016 Budget, which is 3.4% more than last year's budget. As a congregation, we need to come up with approximately \$400/week more than last year's budget. The Stewardship Board worked very hard to keep this increase as small as possible.

During the season of Lent we came as close to making our budget as any other time of the year. For those of you who gave extra during Lent, we would ask you to prayerfully consider giving that same amount extra throughout the rest of the year.

For those of you who could not give extra during Lent, we would ask you to prayerfully consider giving \$5.00/week extra or \$10.00/month extra for the rest of this year. The cost for our gospel ministry keeps increasing. If you continue to give the same amount year after year, we will continue to run further and further behind. So your offering is actually doing less than it was years ago.

Below is an informational chart showing what would happen if everyone was able to give between 3.32% of their income on up to 10.00% of their income. We would ask everyone to prayerfully consider giving within any of these levels. Any of these levels would actually produce a surplus in which to fund Zion Lutheran Church's ongoing ministry.

Based on a 2012 report, the average household income in the Columbus-area zip code of 53925 is \$52,500. Zion had 417 contributors to the general fund in 2014-2015. The rate of giving during the current budget year has been 2.56% (\$112 per household).

With a 2015-2016 budget of \$726,890, in order to balance this budget from our general fund offerings, each household will need to give at a rate of 3.32% of their annual household income (\$145 per month). Contributing at a rate of 5% would bring \$1,094,625, which is 51% above and beyond our budget requirements. What if we were to tithe? This would be \$437 per household each month (which is less than the average new car payment), and we would triple the amount needed to fund our annual budget.




#### What you need:
