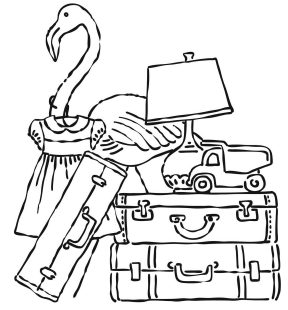

Elders Board by Jeff Krakow

How have you been doing on talking to those around you about your Savior? I know the last couple of months I have been talking about evangelism, but I'm sure you know we have members that are not coming to worship and so despising God's Word. We have to treat them pretty much the same as we treat the unchurched. By their lack of attendance, they aren't hearing His Word anymore than unbelievers do.

How many of you know our mission statement? It's not that hard to memorize, so here it is: *The mission of Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church and School is to preach and teach God's saving Word in all its truth and purity. We are part of the church so that statement stands for what we are to do, preach and teach God's saving Word in all its truth and purity. Somebody in your life needs to know these things. How can you use the talents that God has given to you to share the good news of Jesus' gift?*

Are you having trouble bringing your religion into conversations with others? Here are a few ideas to help you out:

- Talk about your faith and community: speak of church, its gatherings and events, meaningful relationships, and God's work with excitement and joy; it raises intrigue.
 - Share the result of your faith: show people our true rest, joy, peace, and comfort in God alone, because of His ongoing work in us. How does faith impact your daily life?
 - Be generous with praise: whether watching a mountain sunrise or hearing a coworker complain about her assistant, point to beautiful things God has uniquely put in them.
 - Show great grace: instead of engaging in gossip, and instead of interacting with someone who's failed or hurt us, display the grace God first showed us.

(The above points are copied from the book "A Field Guide for Everyday Mission" by Ben Connelly and Bob Roberts, Sr.)

There is much we need to do and it starts with attendance in worship, Bible study, and personal study. God uses us as His tools to tell others of Jesus' gift just as He used others to tell you. Who are the three individuals in your life who most helped you to hear Jesus' voice? Can you think of three people in your life who need to hear about Jesus?

Service Folders

Originally from Beaver Dam, Ian Welch is a graphic designer and composer of liturgical media living in San Diego, CA. He is a graduate of Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary and San Diego State University. Ian designed Zion's logo and website. The following article is reprinted by permission from *Worship the Lord* (No. 73, July 2015), a bimonthly newsletter produced by the WELS Commission on Worship.

Format: Print out your entire service every week.

Yes, this is a lot of work. Yes, it costs more money. Yes, it involves stapling. And yes...it is worth it. Why?

- Going from page 17 in the front of the hymnal to Psalm 85 on page 97, to hymn 370 in the no page number section of the hymnal, back to page 19 for the Creed, is nearly impossible for a first time visitor without pedantic instructions at every step of the service.
- Address that problem by printing the entire liturgy in the service folder every Sunday: all the words, all the responses, all the canticles appear in full. With this format, no one has a problem following the service. No one is lost.
- Put a hymnal in the hand of every worshipper for two reasons: because it shows we are part of a body larger than our congregation, and because the hymnal has great benefit as the prayer book of the people. So the order of service is in the service folder in its entirety, but the hymns are sung from the hymnal.
- Printing the entire service every week allows for great variety in an accessible format. A gathering rite for Advent can be seamlessly brought into the service. Adornments of the liturgy that incorporate congregational sung responses are handled in their place in the service without any page flipping.
- This format provides the opportunity to explain the words, the actions, and the symbolism of liturgical worship to worshippers new to the faith and old. Footnote and explain the history and the content of the *Te Deum*. Footnote and explain the seasons and festivals of the Church Year. Teach some and remind some of the meaning of *Maundy*, and *paschal* and *Agnus Dei*. Explain the advent wreath, the farewell to Alleluia, the reasons we do what we do. [Search for Worship Service Notations at the Worship Website.]

SCRIP YEAR-END SUMMARY



In the 2014-2015 school year, Zion tried something a little different with the Scrip program. For the first time, we allowed the families purchasing the gift cards through Scrip to reap the benefits directly. 50% of the rebates received were directed back to their upcoming tuition bill at Zion, with the other 50% benefiting Zion Lutheran School. Church members without a Zion tuition bill affecting their family were able to designate their rebate toward a relative at Lakeside Lutheran High School, Luther Prep School or direct it towards Zion's Tuition Assistance Fund. The year was a great success as the following statistics show.

Due to church member participation, we are able to grant financial aid to three families for the 2015-2016 school year. One Zion family was able to earn more than enough tuition credit to cover one student for the year. Another family used Scrip gift cards to purchase supplies for a renovation project, earning \$53.75 for Zion. The top three rebate-earners received \$738.00, \$433.13 and \$422.91 toward their tuition bills. We also had extended family members of Zion students participating, allowing ten relatives who aren't Zion members to contribute \$355.91 to their grandchild/niece/nephew's Zion tuition.

Most participants purchased gift cards to cover their normal expenses of gas and groceries with occasional purchases for restaurants or gifts for others. As Zion member Sarah Brey put it, "Scrip has changed the way we look at our finances and budget. If a business doesn't offer Scrip, we won't go there and we'll wait until we have a Scrip card in hand to go out. Scrip has saved us money because we think twice about where and when we shop."

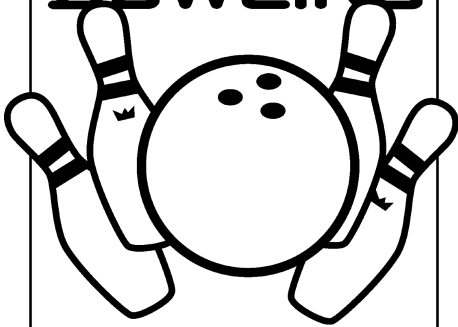

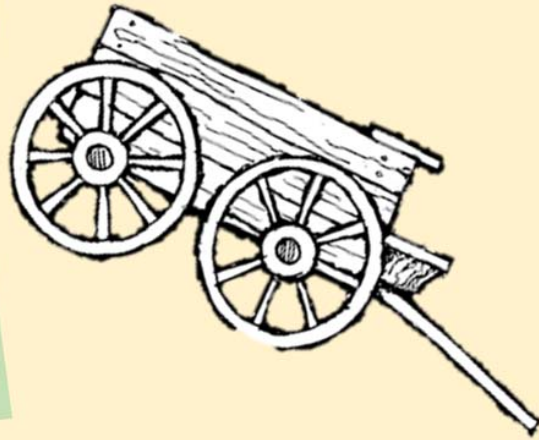
