Saved!

"This water symbolizes baptism that now saves you." 1 Peter 3:21

It was an ugly scene, a violent scene. Death and destruction were everywhere. Water was bursting up from the ground below. Rain was pelting down from the sky above. Waves were churning. Water levels were rising. People were drowning. There was no dry ground to be found. The people could only swim in place for so long. Eventually it became a struggle for them to keep their heads above the water. Soon their lungs filled with water and they sank to the depths below. The flood —it was an ugly scene. Death and destruction were everywhere... outside the ark. But inside the ark? Inside the ark, eight people, along with all of those animals, were safe and secure.

Awesome, isn't it? How the same flood-waters that brought so much death and destruction to the people outside the ark actually saved the people who were in-side the ark? How? How did the flood-waters save Noah and his family? Simply put, the floodwaters enabled that ark to float. The floodwaters lifted Noah and his family above all of the death and destruction below. The water saved Noah and his family.

We deserve death and destruction. We deserve to perish. We deserve to die—forever. We were drowning in a sea of unbelief. Waves of denial, rivers of rejection, and currents of

stubbornness kept us from believing in God, from turning to God, and from trusting in God. Spiritually speaking, we were unable to swim to dry land. We couldn't tread water —we couldn't even keep our heads above the water—and there was no way for us to save ourselves. Our sins weighed us down. They pulled us down. They pulled us under. Drowning in sin and unbelief, we should have perished. But someone spotted us. Someone jumped in to rescue us. Someone reached out to save us.

God did. "He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit" (Titus 3:5). Greater than throwing us a life preserver, God reached out to us in his Word through the water of Holy Baptism. Just like the water of the flood saved Noah, the water of Baptism saved us (1 Peter 3:21). There in a shallow basin of warm water, God saved us from sin, from death, and from the punishment of hell. Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Mark, "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved" (verse 16). Rescued from certain death! Saved for all eternity! And God did it all; he did it all by grace and by grace alone.

What is Scrip?

Scrip is gift cards from local and national retailers available for you to purchase. Gift cards are available for many of the stores and restaurants that you shop at every day including: Amazon, BP, Burger King, Culver's, Kohl's, Kwik Trip, Pick 'n Save, McDonald's, Subway, Walmart, Woodman's and so many more! Using Scrip is like using cash.

Participating retailers help families reduce tuition by agreeing to sell gift cards to Zion at a discount. For instance, a \$25 gift card many be sold to the school for \$20. When you purchase the cards, then, the \$5 difference goes toward the school.Gift cards from Zion are redeemed at the retailer for full face value. Use them just like cash!

50% of the proceeds Scrip generates through orders from parents and relatives can be credited to a current or future student's tuition account. The remaining 50% will be used here at Zion as directed by the Board of Education. It's truly a win-win for families and our school! Even if you don't have a student, you can choose to designate your proceeds to the Tuition Assistance Fund for Zion grade school students!

"You shall have no other gods before me." (Exodus 20:3) What does this mean? We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things. (Luther's Catechism) The world is full of temptations: sports, work, house, possessions,

even self can get top spot over God. "That's mine!" is not something only children say. I have heard many adults say the same thing. "The earth is the LORD's, and everything in it," (Psalm 24:1a). Or maybe we hear something to the effect of "Look how great I am." "I was in charge when this happened or that happened" is also spoken by many adults as if it would never have been accomplished if they weren't the specific person in charge at the time. "the world, and all who live in it;" (Psalm 24:1b). So, whether it's possessions or self, including any talent you have been given, it is the Lord's.

Can idol worshiping cause us to become idle worshipers? Is there something more important on your mind than worship during worship? "That's where I always sit." "Why is the fan on?" "Look at this great building I was in charge of!" "I have to get the house ready for company." Or even worse, is there something more important to you to keep you from attending worship? God says "You shall have no other gods." Yes, that is the first commandment, but listen to what God says leading up to that. In both Exodus and Deuteronomy he says. "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery." (Exodus 20:2 and Deuteronomy 5:6). He wants us to obey his commandments out of love! Even before this he showed his great love for us. After Adam and Eve disobeyed the one command he gave them, "and the LORD God commanded the man, You are free to eat from any tree in the garden; but you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat from it you will certainly die." Building Committee Report

by Jeff Henning Breuer Metal Craftsman, Inc. of Beaver Dam has been selected to

manufacture the bell tower for Zion. Unfortunately, due to their current work load, the delivery is scheduled for mid-January.

The tower is estimated to weigh 8,000 pounds and will stand 32 feet tall. It will be painted with a zinc-rich primer coat that will be similar to a powder-coat finish and painted red (color-matched to the church). Finally, a finish coat of polyurethane will be applied for added protection.

The bell refurbishing project was completed this past April. Our bell is currently in The Verdin Company storage facility in Cincinnati, Ohio. They have agreed to store it for us at no cost until we are ready to receive it.

On the day that the tower arrives, the bell will most likely be bolted to the tower while still on the truck. A crane will then hoist the tower onto the mounting bolts at the base of the tower platform. The bell itself will not move; a mechanism will move a clapper that strikes the bell when a button is pushed from the AV booth at the back of church.

Finally, on a date yet to be determined, the same roofer that installed our church roof will return to install a metal roof on top of the tower that is identical to the church roof.

As we near our tower delivery, we hope for little or no snow and warmer weather to aid with the installation of this beautiful addition to Zion. Please be patient with the process. We think you will be pleased.

We look forward to seeing you on September 11th. Sunday School that day will start with an opening devotion in the school gym.


