This year in our monthly articles we are considering favorite verses from the Bible. This month's favorite Bible verse is:

"The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not be in want."

John D. Rockefeller was one of the richest men in the world. An interviewer once asked him, "How much money is enough?" Rockefeller replied, "Just a little bit more."

How many times have we told ourselves that if we had "just a little bit more" we would be happy? A higher-paying job. A larger home. An earlier retirement. Better health. Successful children.

But what happens when those wants are met? Are people truly happy? And what happens when those wants aren't met? When you find yourself unemployed. When in rough times your savings are

depleted. When plans for better housing or earlier retirement have to be put on hold. When your health takes a turn for the worse or your children struggle in school. Where do you turn? Turn to Jesus and remember, "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not be in want." We might not have everything we want in life, but Jesus, our Good Shepherd, has truly given us everything we need. He's given us his word. He's given

us his promises. He assures us that our sins are forgiven and eternal life in heaven is ours through his death and resurrection.

He promises to provide for all of our physical and spiritual needs richly and abundantly here on earth until he takes us to the glorious home that he has prepared for us in heaven. There we will experience the fulfillment of his promise, "You will fill me with joy in your presence, with eternal pleasures at your right hand" (Psalm 16:11).

Not long after his death, someone came up to the accountant of John D. Rockefeller and said, "We know Rockefeller was a very wealthy man. How much did he leave?" The only things that will go with us from this life to the next are the spiritual treasures that belong to us through faith in Jesus.

What do we want out of life? What we need the most has already been fully and freely supplied by Jesus, our Good Shepherd. So, what more could we want? What more could we need?

Communion During "Safer at Home"

Loved ones,

"They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer." (Acts 2:42, NIV)

"For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes." (1 Corinthians 11:26, NIV)

The need for the gospel

Christians need the gospel. Christians grow very aware of their need for the gospel during times of hardship – personal or national – as hardship reminds us of our weakness, our mortality, and of our dependence on God. The gospel is God's good news in which he fulfills our every spiritual need with forgiveness and grace.

God gives us the gospel in three ways – through baptism, the spoken and written Word, and holy communion. The Church calls these tools of the Holy Spirit "the means of grace."

Using each of the means of grace

does the same thing: it conveys the message of Jesus' love, forgiveness, and salvation to our hearts. If a Christian does not see a need to be baptized, to regularly hear and read the Word, or to receive communion, there is typically something seriously wrong with his/her faith.

You must know this during a time when we are restricted in our ability to receive the means of grace in the manner to which we are accustomed. The current law prohibits us from gathering in groups of more than 10 people. As Christians we both desire to

obey the earthly authorities God has placed over us and we desire the means of grace. We have stopped holding on-site worship, but have been offering online worship. We have stopped meetings and classes and school, but are meeting online for: Bible study, as a faculty, and as boards and committees. We are doing everything we can think of to partake of the means of grace in a godly way.

Communion

What about communion? While a Christian will feel a need for communion because it is a means of grace, communion is not absolutely necessary to sustain your faith. The Holy Spirit will sustain our faith as we continue with online worship, Bible study, Bible reading and prayer on your own. For children, people in military service -- to name just two examples -- God sustains their faith through the gospel in his spoken and read Word. This means that if you are not comfortable taking communion, if you are at risk for infection or might possibly in any way put others at risk, it is not necessary that you take communion

during the current crisis.

However, if you are confident that you can safely come to church, we will be offering communion by appointment.

Here is how it will work...

You may sign up online (preferred) at www.zioncolumbus.org to

receive communion or call the church office for an appointment. We will have chapels set up in the sanctuary and the library for you to have a short devotion with one of our pastors with enough time in between for us to sanitize and prepare for the next group.

Please take every precaution in coming to church for communion.

Wash your hands often. Do not touch your face.

- Do not touch door handles. Use the "handicap accessible button" to enter the church.
- Do not touch light switches. Motion sensors will turn the lights off and on.
- Do not linger to interact with another group that may be at church. While we are allowed to have more than one group of ten or fewer in the facility at one time, they are not to interact and risk spreading infection.

Thank you for understanding our precautions. Out of love for God, let's do what we can to stay strong in the faith and watch out for each other.

We try to get an interview of someone who is important to our congregation in each monthly *Messenger*. Pastor Tim Gumm has been serving our neighboring congregations in Fall River, St. Stephens and in Doylestown (St. John's) for a couple years now. Mrs. Gumm teaches piano at Zion.

1. Give us some background - Where did each of you grow up - How did you meet and marry - where have you lived and served? Tim grew up in Downer's Grove, Illinois and Linda grew up on a dairy farm in Watertown, Wisconsin. They met on the campus of current Luther Prep School; Tim was at Northwestern College and Linda attended Northwestern Prep. Tim was assigned to Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in West Allis after graduation from the Seminary. He served there for 10 years before accepting the call to serve Peace in Loves Park, Illinois. He served the members of Peace for 25 years, and then accepted the call to St. Stephen's and St. John's. By God's grace, we will be celebrating our 40th wedding anniversary this coming June.

- 2. What do you have for kids and grandkids? We have 4 adult married children, and 15 grandchildren. One family lives in Florida, and all the rest reside in Wisconsin. There are 5 teachers and one pastor among the adult children.
- 3. How do you like Fall River? We are still getting used to (very) small town living. We came from a "suburb" of Rockford; the Rockford metro-area population is around 250,000. So it's a bit different for us!
- 4. When you aren't doing things involved with church, how do you like to spend your time? We love to travel and spend time with our kids and grandkids. We enjoy being outside, and you can find us out on the deck or around the fire pit in the middle of winter.
- 5. What do you personally do to keep your faith strong? A rich blessing of the schedule change when moving to Fall River was the allowance of ample morning devotional time.
- 6. Pastor Gumm, what kind of ministry experience do you like the most? What's the most challenging for you? I love preaching and teaching. Ministering to inactives is the most challenging for me.
- 7. Mrs Gumm, what's your experience as a piano teacher? What is your student load/role at Zion? My experience as a piano teacher began at Zion! I thought about giving lessons for years, and this was just the opportune time and place! I have 16 students at Zion School on Wednesdays, and one Zion student comes to my home on Monday afternoons. During Safer at Home, I'm giving virtual lessons. I love it!!!! I love being able to teach hymns to the children and talk about the possibility of them playing for worship someday.
- 8. What do you hope for when it comes to the relationship between St. John's/St. Stephens/Zion? By that I mean, do you see a lot of connections between the churches? Do you have any hopes for the future as to how things might be different? I hope that our families with children will make use of the Christian education offered at Zion.


