WHEN I AM TIRED

Even on the most regular day, life is draining. The work day is long and the demands are great. The commute, getting the kids to school, work schedules, meeting deadlines, grocery shopping, getting dinner ready, children's activities, only to get ready to do it over again the next day. Getting older doesn't help matters. By the time you hit the pillow at night you may feel like a smart device that has only 2% battery life left.

But what do you do when you become tired emotionally? It's the exhaustion that comes from strained relationships, heated arguments and being rejected by those from whom you want acceptance.

Then there's that inner weariness—the kind that no one else knows you have except you. The weariness that comes from the burden of sin and guilt. It comes when you must live in the brokenness of past mistakes. When things don't go so well on any given day, you wonder if God is angry and out to get you. The earthly consequences of your sins and knowledge of your guilt is...well...spiritually tiring.

Questions for Noah and Melissa Litherland

1. Where did each of you grow up? Where did you go to school?

Urgent Voter's Meeting

For many years we have "borrowed" from our Undesignated Fund to remedy the continual shortfall of offerings in the General Fund. Because of this, our Undesignated Fund is almost depleted. One bad month, either a significant drop in offerings or a large invoice such as the \$8,000 insurance payment that is due in October, and we may not be able to pay all of our bills.

The sad part of this is that while we have used undesignated money to cover our lack of first fruits giving, we have forfeited being able to use the money for ministries like outreach or school tuition aid or even using as a down payment on a new school building.

So now we must make tough decisions and we need you to be part of it. A special vital meeting will be held on Sunday, September 30th after the second service. We will start with an informational meeting right after the service in which all members are encouraged to participate. Following that, we will hold a voter's meeting to determine the direction we as a congregation want to take.

This is our church, this is our problem and you are needed to help determine how we can remedy the situation.
