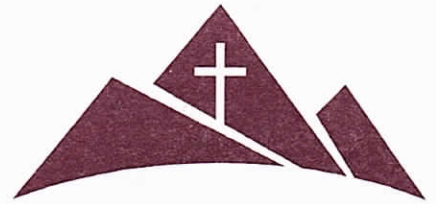

## Paul and Tammy Musser

1. *Where did each of you grow up and go to school?*

- You talked, we listened! Thanks to everyone who filled out the survey online or in- person. We will do the best we can to include the cards you specified. Very soon, you will be seeing increased inventories of your favorites, as well as the addition of Christmas favorites like Amazon, Barnes & Noble, Noodles & Co., and more!
- Now through December 14, Scrip has many low-denomination cards available to use as stocking stuffers or as a little something "extra" to include with a gift. \$10 Amazon, \$5 Taco Bell, \$5 Starbucks, and \$10 Target are just a few of the many low-denomination cards you can purchase.
