

I thank God for allowing me, a sinner, to be one of the shepherds here, taking care of the flock entrusted to my care. I thank God for surrounding me with pastors, teachers and secretaries whom I have worked with and who have helped to make my ministry a real joy. I thank God for the many Zion members who have given of their time to serve on boards, councils, committees, in the choirs and the list could go on and on. I thank God for allowing me to bring comfort to families who are going through difficult times or grieving over the death of a loved one. I thank God for the privilege of watching young couples starting their lives together and pronouncing them husband and wife. I thank God for the privilege of being able to preach law and Gospel from the pulpit at Zion and assuring you that your sins are forgiven and heaven is yours. I thank God for the love and support, the friendship and encouraging words that come from you. I thank God for the many opportunities I have had to worship and pray with you. In general, I thank God for all of you, my Zion family.

You can see why I echo Jacob's words. "I am unworthy of all the kindness and faithfulness you have shown your servant." In the hassle of church life, sometimes we forget who we are. Luther's teachings rocked the world because they called people back to an understanding of the Bible that had been lost among the distractions that occurred throughout church history. It is therefore sometimes good for us amid our distractions to look at some of the ideas of Luther that revolutionized theology and gave us our Lutheran heritage.
