Hannah Rodewald

1st and 2nd Grade Teacher, Zion Lutheran School

1. Where did each of you grow up and go to school? Hannah: I was born in Rockford, Illinois. I have lived in New Ulm, Minnesota since I was four. I attended St. Paul's Lutheran School for grade school. I graduated from Minnesota Valley Lutheran High School and Martin Luther College. Joe: I was born in Saginaw, Michigan and lived there for 8 years before my dad accepted a call as

pastor in Simpsonville, South Carolina. I lived in South Carolina for 6 years before going to Luther Prep for high school and then to MLC for college.

2. What do you have for family? Hannah: My dad is a professor at MLC and my mom serves as one of MLC's receptionists. I have one older sister, Abby Smart. She is currently in grad school at the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities. She married her husband, Keenan, this past August. A crazy summer for our family! Joe: My dad is a pastor at Abiding Peace Lutheran Church in Simpsonville, SC and my mom serves as a Kindergarten teacher at our school there. My oldest

brother is currently pursuing his Doctorate in English Education at the University of Florida and my other older brother is serving as pastor at Paradise Valley Lutheran Church in Phoenix, AZ.

3. How did each of you decide that you wanted to go into the ministry?

Hannah: Growing up, my parents were always very encouraging as I thought about the future. Many members of my extended family are in the ministry and I learned how rewarding it is to serve in that way. Continuous support from friends and family brought us to where we are today!

Joe: My parents were always encouraging me to consider ministry but made it clear that I could pursue other areas of service. In high school, my teachers and coaches offered great encouragement and pointed out specific gifts that I had which could be used for ministry.

4. What do you remember from call day?

Hannah: I remember the high emotions in the gym and having absolutely no idea where we would be assigned. Not only were Joe and I waiting for assignment, but we also anxiously awaited to hear where our closest friends would be sent. I can't say I've ever experienced feelings like that before.

Joe: Call day was a surreal experience and one that I will always remember. I remember feeling a combination of excitement and nerves for the two of us and my friends receiving calls. I specifically

remember looking around as we were singing "Holy God, We Praise Your Name" and being thankful for my friends and family who are now going all over the country to serve in God's Kingdom.

5. What do you remember from your first day teaching?

Hannah: It was a blur! I remember feeling so welcomed by my wonderful class. We were all nervous, but made it through together. It is crazy to think that it has already been two months since that day!

Joe: I remember being very nervous all morning, but once I met the students and we got started with class I felt much more comfortable and excited.

6. <u>Joe, what are your duties at Luther Preparatory</u> School?

Joe: Some of my duties at LPS include: Serving as a tutor in the dorm, helping coach Cross Country, teaching senior American History, driving the bus for various student activities, taking students to doctor appointments, giving evening chapel and offering council and encouragement to the students.

7. What about teaching has been more challenging than you expected? What has been more fun than you thought it would be?

Hannah: Having no previous experience as the lead teacher in a classroom has been the biggest challenge. However, there have already been plenty of trials and errors that I have turned into great things! Each day comes with another day of experience that I am grateful for. I could not have predicted such a fun dynamic for a class. Each student brings unique gifts and personalities that, together, make an awesome little family!


Joe: I think the biggest challenge for teaching comes from teaching seniors in high school. Pushing and challenging the students in my class is something that I continue to strive to do each day. I have loved getting to know my students more and loved the opportunity to have meaningful and deep conversations in class.

8. What kind of habits are you developing that keep your personal faith in Jesus strong?

Hannah: The daily reminders that I give my students about our Savior also serve as

reminders for myself! My drive to and from school has become a time for me to take my thoughts and bring them to God in prayer. It is a great start and end to my school day. *Joe*: Being able to lead chapel has been a great opportunity for me to keep my personal faith with Jesus strong. I have loved getting into a habit of examining an assigned text, diving into commentaries and finding a way to relate it to high school students. It has truly been a blessing.

Make a plan By Pastor Matt Ewart Time of Grace

If you believe Jesus is worthy to be worshiped, do you know what he said about giving? The Lord Jesus himself said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive."

Do you wish you were more generous? Sure you do—who doesn't? *How* to become more generous is the question.

You might think that more money would make you more generous. That sounds good at first, but between the lines you are actually blaming God for your lack of generosity: until he gives you more money, you can't be generous.

Since blaming God never seems to end well, let's think through this a different way. God's greatest act of generosity did not require money. It required a plan and a sacrifice. Might the model of generosity he wants you to follow be similar?

Make a plan. Throw away the list of everything God *hasn't* given you and replace it with an inventory of what he *has* given you. Then the first thing you do is decide how much to give back to him through an offering.

So how much should you give? That's a fair question, but there's actually a better one that you can ask. It might scare you, but it goes like this: How much money do you have to sacrifice before you are forced to trust God with what's left?

"Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7).

Having a plan insulates you from giving reluctantly or out of compulsion. A plan that includes sacrificial giving moves you to trust in God every day. Generous people don't make more money. They make a plan.
