Can God keep me safe?

One summer night during a severe thunderstorm, a mother was tucking her small daughter into bed. She was about to turn the light off when the little girl asked in a trembling voice, "Mommy, will you stay with me all night?" Smiling, the mother gave her a warm, reassuring hug and said tenderly, "I can't, dear. I have to sleep in Daddy's room." A long silence

followed. At last, it was broken by a shaky voice saying, "The big sissy!"

All of us have fears. And they don't always end with a chuckle. Our fears may be rational or completely irrational, but when we

experience them, they are definitely real. At times we are afraid and may wonder, "Can God help me?"

On another night, Jesus Christ's disciples were caught in a storm on the Sea of Galilee. Their fear was very real, too. Jesus came to them and said, "Take courage! It is I. Do not be afraid" (Mark 6:50). Jesus was there, and they didn't need to be afraid any longer. He displayed his almighty power by calming the wind and waves.

Jesus can help us with our fears, as well. He controls all things and promises to use his power to help those who trust in him. When Jesus is in our lives, we can take courage and not be afraid.

While his promises are true for all kinds of fears, they are especially true for our spiritual concerns. Many are afraid of dying and having to stand before a perfect God and answer for their imperfect lives. Jesus encourages us even in these great fears. He said, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die" (John 11:25,26).

Life on this earth will end for all people, but Jesus promises that those who believe in him will live with him in heaven eternally. Jesus died on the cross to take our sins away so that God will not condemn believers in judgment but will

give them eternal life in heaven. This is the comfort and courage that God gives to those who trust him.

The Bible is filled with examples of God's power and his many promises to help us



Zion Starts a New School Year

Zion was blessed to be able to begin another school year on Tuesday, August 22nd. 83 students started the school year under the theme: "Growing Together in Christ." Our theme comes from 2 Peter 3:18: "But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be glory both now and forever!" Zion welcomes our new 1-2nd grade teacher, Mrs. Rebecca Prell, and our new 4K teacher's aide, Mrs. Anita Sharpee, to our faculty. We eagerly await a year of learning, growth, and memorable experiences.

Many have asked for an update about our school roof. For those that may not know, a part of our school roof came off during a storm on July 28. It was approximately a 30' by 30' section of rubber roofing material and insulation over the metal decking above our 1-2nd grade classroom. Inside damage was minimal due to extraordinary volunteers willing to clean up the water quickly. A roofing company came and installed a temporary roof. So we are okay for now, although that classroom's air conditioning needs to be repaired. Our leaders have contacted the insurance company, insurance adjusters, and contractors to get the issues fixed as quickly as possible. I have learned that this process can take time, and we are patiently waiting for everyone to accomplish what they need. We are thankful that we can still have classes and provide a safe environment for our students.

Please keep Zion School in your prayers as we continue to follow our mission to partner with parents and reach out to the community to educate God's precious lambs.

1. Let's start with your family: Where did you grow up? How did you meet and marry?

5. What are the hardest personal challenges to your faith that you face today? What do you do to deal with those challenges?

We tend to worry about the turmoil our world is in and what it will be like for our grandchildren, of

which we have seven. We have to remember that God is in control and we need to try to not worry about this.

6. If you would, talk about your spiritual path on which God guided you. How did you come to be a part of Zion?

Church has always been a part of our lives. Rick went to Catholic grade school and I was Lutheran. When we married, I joined his church because we knew we

wanted to have our family as one unit. But it has always been based around God and church. We were very active in our last church and tried to help whenever we could.
